
IMPORTANT UPDATE Burloak Drive: 10-Day Closure

June 14-24, 2024



CHANGES TO THE 10-DAY CLOSURE OF BURLOAK DRIVE

- The road closure will begin at 7:00 pm on Friday, June 14 through to 06:30 am on Monday, June 24, 2024.
- The road will be completely closed, except from 3:00 pm to 7:00 pm, Monday to Friday (June 17-21), when it will be open for southbound traffic only (see plan above).
- The intersection of Burloak Drive and Prince William Drive will remain open to traffic during the closure.

WHY ARE WE DOING THIS?

We need to separate the road to go under the railway line at Burloak Drive. This project will improve safety for pedestrians and vehicles and optimize traffic flow at this crossing. These works are needed for Metrolinx's GO Expansion program which will increase services on the Lakeshore West rail corridor.



WHAT WORK IS TAKING PLACE?

Construction activity	Scheduled Start Date	Expected Duration	Work Hours	Description of Work
Track Diversion	June 14- - 24, 2024	10 days	Day and night work; Monday - Monday	We will be diverting tracks to the south of the existing railway corridor to build the grade separated junction.
Shoring				Caisson (bored) drilling along the railway corridor and Burloak Drive.

Work durations are approximate, work may be rescheduled due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.

WHAT TO EXPECT

There will be a 10-day road closure on Burloak Drive from Harvester/Wyecroft Road to Prince William Drive/Superior Court. The sidewalk and bicycle lane will also be closed.

The southbound lanes will be reopened from 3pm to 7pm on weekdays (Monday to Friday) to alleviate peak afternoon traffic.

Staff will be positioned at key intersections to help manage traffic.

Surrounding residents and businesses may experience traffic disruption, noise, dust, and vibration from the construction.

Two temporary lanes – one going in each direction, from Prince William Drive to the plaza at 700-728 Burloak Drive will be open, maintaining access to the businesses.

Contractors will take reasonable precautions to minimize disturbances to residents and businesses including but not limited to the following:

- Ongoing monitoring for noise and dust
- Regular sweeping of streets.
- Mud mats at site exit points to control and prevent dirt from leaving the site.
- Detour routes outlined during intersection closures with required signage.
- Limiting construction traffic and no parking on public streets.
