
Upcoming Track Closures at Long Branch GO

Project Overview

Metrolinx's GO Expansion program is delivering more GO service across the network, including trains every 15-minutes or better on the Lakeshore West Rail Corridor. To support GO Expansion, we are upgrading the rail network and our GO stations to enable more frequent and fully accessible services. This includes accessibility and amenity improvements to Toronto's Long Branch GO Station located at 20 Brow Drive in Etobicoke.

What is happening?

Starting June 15 crews will continue to place caps on top of micro-piles. Multiple caps may be installed per day. Starting September 21, crews will be installing temporary rail bridges on top of the current tracks so that trains can pass over the construction activities for the new pedestrian tunnels. Construction activities and dates are listed overleaf.



Construction activity	Weekend working dates	Working hours	Description of work
Micro-piling and capping	June 15-16	Day and night construction activities	Completion of micro-piling on the east side of the tracks. Metal caps will be placed on top of all micropiles to prepare for placement of temporary rail bridges (see below). The station will remain open over these weekends, but some train services may be affected. Please check www.gotransit.com before travelling.

Track rail bridge installation	Sept 21-22		Temporary rail bridges will be placed on the tracks so that trains can continue to run over the pedestrian tunnel construction activities. The station will be open for the weekend of September 21-22 but will be closed over the weekend of November 29-30 and there will be no train services over this weekend.

HOURS OF WORK

- Construction work is expected to take place through-out Saturday and Sunday
- For safety reasons, this work also needs to take place overnight when there are less trains running along the Lakeshore West rail corridor.

WHAT TO EXPECT

- Residents should expect some noise, vibration, dust, and site lighting.
- Our staff will take reasonable precautions to minimize disturbances to residents and commuters, including but not limited to the following:
 - Reduced idling of non-essential equipment
 - Pointing lights away from residential windows

• The work area will be safely secured.

TRAFFIC DETAILS

 Increased construction vehicles and equipment can be expected in the vicinity of the work area.

PEDESTRIAN DETAILS

- There are no pedestrian sidewalk closures planned for these construction activities.
- Please continue to exercise caution around active construction sites.
