What is happening?

• As early as Monday, May 27, 2024, crews will begin site preparation and mobilization for support of excavation work for the future Ontario Line interchange station at Pape Station.



- Preparation and mobilization activities will include the installation of a slurry plant and a drilling platform. Slurry is a mix of clay and water and will be used to build a new foundation for the station. The slurry plant will produce slurry as well as process soil excavated during the building of the foundation.
- All work will take place Monday to Saturday between 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

What to Expect

- To complete this work safely, the north sidewalk on Danforth Ave. will be closed. A temporary crosswalk at Eaton Ave. will be installed to allow pedestrians to safely cross Danforth Ave.
- Noise from construction equipment including cranes, excavators, bobcats, hand tools, and trucks can be expected.
- After installation, silos from the support excavation equipment plants will be visible from outside the work zone.
- Short-term traffic interruptions can be expected while trucks and equipment enter and exit work zones; traffic control personnel will be present to direct vehicles and pedestrians. In late June, trucks will begin entering the site via Eaton Ave. and exiting via Gertrude Pl. & Danforth Ave. Access and exit points are indicated on the map.
- Construction equipment and materials will be secured within the work zones.
- Signage and safety barriers will be in place to delineate work zones.
- The installation of permanent site hoarding.
- This work may be delayed due to inclement weather and/or unforeseen circumstances.

About the project

- 15 stops and more than 40 connections to other transit, including GO train, subway, LRT, streetcar and bus lines.
