

LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT



York Street Track Construction Update




York Street - Queen and York

- As early as **June 10**, crews will begin working in the Queen Street West and York Street intersection to install streetcar tracks.
- One lane westbound on Queen will be maintained at all times.
- This specific phase of work is expected to be completed by the end of July 2024.
- One lane northbound on York Street will be maintained at all times.
- No left turns from the northbound lane of University Avenue onto Queen
 Street West will be permitted during this phase of work.
- No left turns from Queen Street West onto York Street will be permitted.
- A Paid Duty Officer will assist with traffic control and pedestrian safety.

York Street - Richmond and York

- Over a temporary period, crews will be fully closing the York Street and Richmond Street intersection for track installation work (refer to map).
- Work is expected to begin on Saturday, June 15 at 6:00 a.m. until Tuesday, June 18 at 6:00 a.m.
- Crews will be working 24/7 to complete the work. Once completed, the intersection will be re-opened.
- One northbound lane on York Street will be maintained.
- Paid Duty Officers will be stationed at intersections throughout the area to assist with traffic control, deliveries, and pedestrian safety.

- Once this work is complete, crews will resume working in the
 Queen Street West and York Street intersection.

Utility and Sewer Investigations

Monitoring device installations ongoing

Site preparation

- Removal of light posts and overhead cables in the work zones ongoing.
- Utilities decommissioning and installation of monitoring devices underway.
- Plywood hoarding installation is underway.
 - West: Installation is in progress on Queen Street West near James underway.
 - East: Installation expected to begin this week.

Traffic Signal Relocations

 Traffic signal changes at the intersection of Queen Street East and Victoria Street expected to start this week.

Piling - West Site

 Piling began on June 10 on the west site, near Queen Street West and James Street.

Work in Progress

Pedestrian Detour

- The sidewalk in front of 1 Queen Street East will be open for another two months and will close only for any nearby works for public safety.
- Once piling on the east site commences, the sidewalk in front of 1 Queen Street East will be closed.
- During piling on the east site, to maintain access to Yonge and Victoria Streets on the south side of Queen Street East, a temporary detour will be set up through the 1 Queen Street East building.
- The emergency exit at 1 Queen Street East will be always kept clear.

Work in Progress

West site preparation: Extension of the work zone

- To provide a noise and safety barrier from the construction works, crews will be installing plywood hoarding on the west site of the Queen Street work zone, between James Street and Yonge Street.
- Work is expected to start as early as June 13.
- To maintain public safety during upcoming heavy construction work, the pedestrian walkway between the Eaton Centre and Hudson's Bay Company will be closed.
- Access to other surrounding buildings, TTC, and the PATH will remain open.
- Wayfinding signage will be installed throughout the area.

Upcoming Work

Planters Removal at 1 Queen Street East

 Planters expected to enable future piling activity in this area, as there is an investigation on the electrical connections. Bus shelter removed inside site.

TTC Feeder Cable Relocation

 TTC Feeder Cable to be relocated on Queen Street West near Bay Street; expected to start in the next two weeks and will take approximately one month to complete.

Utility and Sewer Investigations and Monitoring Points

Additional monitoring device installations in future work stages.

Access Points


The following access routes are expected:

West Site:

Trucks expected to enter and exit via James Street, Queen Street West and Yonge Street.

East Site:

Trucks expected to enter and exit via Yonge Street and Victoria Street.




Map of expected Queen site access points.

Site Maintenance

Ongoing efforts to ensure cleanliness and safety, such as:

- Removing debris around the site.
- Controlling dust using a variety of methods, such as street sweepers and wheel cleaning as needed to ensure soil/sediment is kept off city streets and sidewalks
- Installing clear wayfinding signage.
- Performing daily site safety checks and addressing hazards immediately.
- Regular inspection of the site for graffiti and removal when necessary.
- Upkeeping tools and machinery, conducting regular inspections, and ensuring utilities function properly.
- Winter maintenance plans will be shared later in the year.

Reducing Impacts

To reduce impacts to residents and businesses in the area, mitigations will be in place including:

- Air quality monitoring to track dust debris and vehicle emissions to ensure that construction activities don't impact the quality of the environment.
- Dust suppression by regularly moistening soils to prevent dust from becoming airborne
- Site hoarding where possible to help reduce noise.
- Continuous loop truck routes, reducing the need for trucks to reverse using back-up alarms.
- Street sweepers and wheel cleaning to ensure soil and sediment is kept off city streets and sidewalks.



Queen Station 2024 Construction Look-Ahead

Major construction milestones to propel the Ontario Line subway forward.

Time	Activity	Details & Purpose
Spring/ Summer 2024	Site Preparation	Preparation of sites for future construction, as lands are provided to OTG.
Spring 2024	Hoarding installation	Installation of Phase 1 permanent (plywood) site hoarding
Summer - early Winter 2024	Piling	Piling work around the perimeter of the future station ensures structural support.
