
New date: Water Shut-Off on De Grassi Street

Shut-off date: Tuesday, July 16, 2024 (was previously Friday, July 12)

Work dates: Monday, July 15 to Friday, July 19, 2024

Hours: 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Affected area: De Grassi St. between Wardell St. and Queen St. E.



What is happening?

- On **Tuesday, July 16, 2024**, the watermain on Degrassi Street will be shut down to enable sewer installation work.
- Water service will be shut off at properties on Degrassi St. between Wardell St. and Queen St. E. on each day between 9 a.m. - 4 p.m. - affected properties are listed below.
- Water service will be restored upon completion of the work.
- Watermain work will continue from Monday, July 15 to Friday, July 19, 2024, and will
 include compaction of asphalt and granular material (paving)- vibrations can be
 expected at nearby properties during compaction work.



- Monitoring is in place to ensure vibration levels remain within acceptable limits.
- Temporary parking and sidewalk closures will be required to safely perform these activities; please refer to the **Parking and pedestrian details** section below for specific information.

Affected properties:

- The following properties will be affected by this water shut-off:
 - o 2 48 Degrassi Street (even numbers only)

Parking and pedestrian details

- A portion of the sidewalk on the east side of De Grassi Street north of Queen Street East will be closed during the sewer installation.
- The south entrance to Bruce Mackey Park will be closed. The park will remain accessible through the north entrance, as indicated on the map.
- Street parking on Degrassi Street will be restricted in some areas to safely separate the work zone and allow space for construction.
- Street parking restrictions may start earlier to give enough time for residents to find alternate arrangements.

What to expect

- Water service will be periodically unavailable while this work takes place please carefully review the details above.
- Noise and vibration from construction equipment including a hydro-vacuum truck, excavators, vibratory rollers, trucks, compressor, and other equipment.
- Crews will install two new manholes and a sanitary sewer line.
- Advance signage will be in place to direct vehicles, pedestrians, and cyclists.
- Traffic barrels, fencing, and barriers will be in place to separate and secure work zones.
- Construction equipment and materials will be properly secured within the work zones.
- Traffic control personnel will be present while this work takes place.
- Work may be delayed due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.

About the project

- 15.6-kilometre subway line that will make it faster and easier to travel within Toronto and beyond.
- 15 stops and more than 40 transit connections, including GO, TTC, and more.
- Approximately 30 minutes from one end of the line to the other.
- 28,000 fewer cars on the road each day.
