

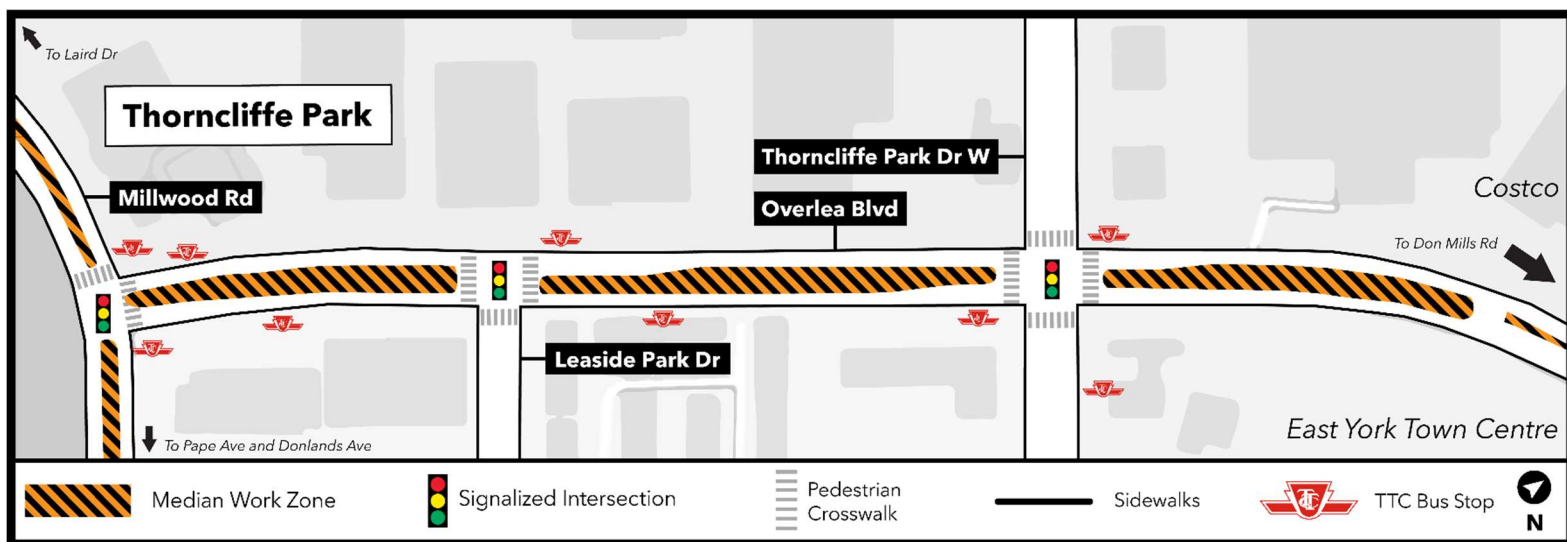
REMINDER: Median modifications along Overlea Boulevard and Millwood Road

Expected start date: July 17, 2024

Expected duration: Four to six weeks

Days of work: Monday to Friday

Hours of work: 7 a.m. to 4 p.m.



What is happening?

- Starting as early as July 17, crews will begin work to modify the medians in the centre of Millwood Road north and south of Overlea Boulevard, and in the centre of Overlea Boulevard from Millwood Road to just east of Thorncliffe Park Drive West (approximately in front of Costco).
- This work will help prepare the roadway for future phases of Ontario Line construction and traffic patterns.
- Some medians will be removed and paved over, and some will be rebuilt into a different shape.
- The median modifications will take place on City of Toronto property.
- All work will take place Monday to Friday between 7 a.m. and 4 p.m. for approximately four to six weeks.
- The Thorncliffe Park gateway monument located in the centre median at Overlea Boulevard and Millwood Road will be safely removed and stored for the duration of the Ontario Line project to facilitate construction works. The monument will be reinstated at a location to be determined in the future in coordination with the City of Toronto.

What to expect

- Temporary fencing, hoarding, or concrete barriers will be installed around the various work areas for safety.
- Periodic lane, sidewalk, and crosswalk closures will be needed to safely accommodate workers and equipment. Clear detour signage will be in place to safely re-route drivers and pedestrians.
- At least one lane in each direction will remain open at all times.
- Work will be conducted using excavators, breakers, loaders, and dump trucks.
- Noise, vibration, and dust from the tools and equipment listed are expected to be minimal, however monitoring stations will be installed to measure noise and vibration levels and water will be used to reduce any dust.
- No impacts to TTC bus services are anticipated from this work, and all existing TTC bus stops will remain in their current locations. However, if needed, qualified personnel will be on site to safely direct buses and guide riders around construction zones.
- All required permits have been obtained from the City of Toronto for this work.
- This work may be delayed due to inclement weather and/or unforeseen circumstances.

About the Ontario Line

- 15.6-kilometre subway line that will make it faster and easier to travel within Toronto and beyond.
- 15 stops and more than 40 connections to other transit, including GO train, subway, LRT, streetcar, and bus lines.
- Less than 30 minutes from one end of the line to the other.
- 28,000 fewer cars on the road each day.
