

Periodic Saturday work at Moss Park Station

What is happening?

- Periodic work activities will be taking place on Saturdays between 7:00 a.m and 2:00 p.m commencing Saturday, July 27th through to September 31st, 2024.
- The station team has moved into the next major phase of construction: excavation of the station shaft. To maintain the schedule and progress of station construction, additional site prep and general works will be carried out periodically on Saturdays during the summer months. This is in addition to the current Monday to Friday work schedule. There will be no excavation works taking place on the weekend.
- Residents will see equipment moving around the site and hear construction noise from various machinery, as well as vehicles entering and exiting the site.
- To reduce the impact to residents and businesses in the area, mitigation measures have been put into place, which include noise and vibration monitoring, no overnight work and enhanced site hoarding.

About the Ontario Line

- 15.6-kilometre subway line that will make it faster and easier to travel within Toronto and beyond.
- 15 stops and more than 40 connections to other transit, including GO train, subway, LRT, streetcar, and bus lines.
- Less than 30 minutes from one end of the line to the other.
- 28,000 fewer car trips each day.
