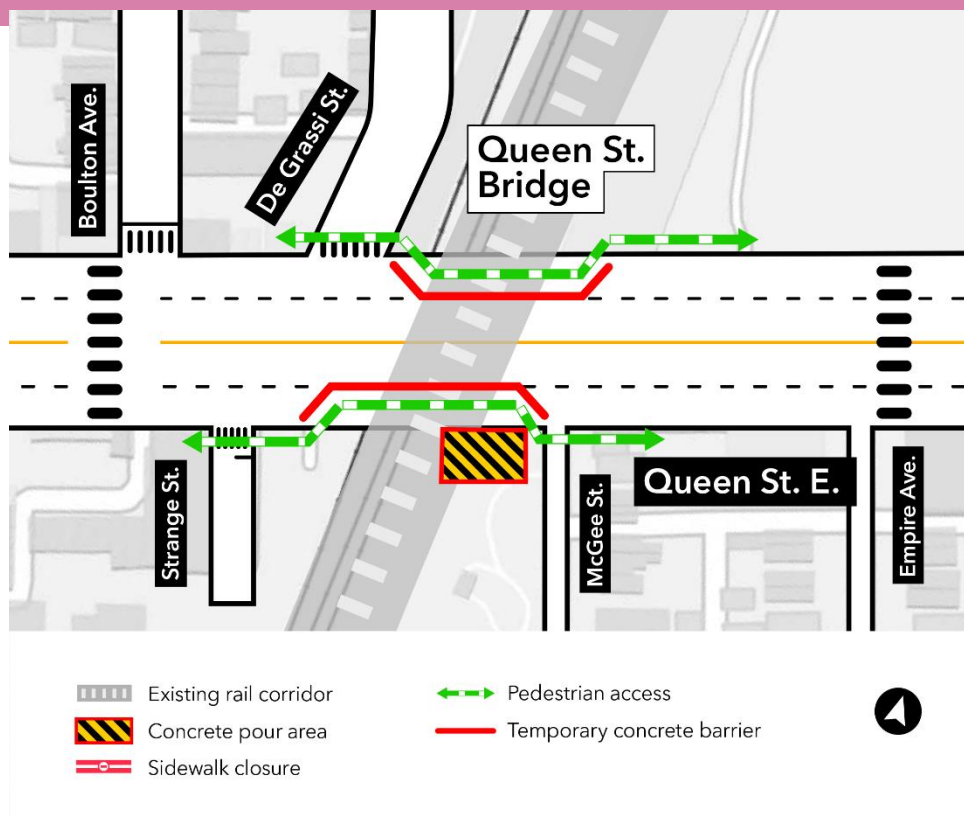


Early morning concrete pour at Queen Street East bridge

Date: Thursday, August 1, 2024

Hours of work: Starting at 5 a.m. for approximately ten hours



What is happening?

- On Thursday, August 1, 2024, a major concrete pour will take place at the Queen Street East bridge.
- To ensure the integrity of the pour, work will begin as early at 5 a.m.
- The concrete will form a permanent section of the new bridge - the bridge abutment footing.
- Approximately 240 cubic metres of concrete will be poured.
- Four concrete trucks are expected per hour.
- Crews will do their best to mitigate disruption during the pour.

Traffic and pedestrian details

- Concrete trucks will enter and exit the site from the access road at the south-east corner of McGee Street and Queen Street East.
- One traffic lane in each direction will be maintained on Queen Street East.
- No sidewalk closures are expected.
- Traffic may be stopped for short durations while trucks enter and exit the site.
- Overhead pedestrian coverings (scaffolding) will be installed as an additional safety measure, providing further separation between the sidewalks and work areas.

What to expect

- Concrete trucks staging (queuing) in/around the site.
- Noise from construction equipment including concrete trucks and pumps can be expected.
- Noise mitigation measures will be implemented where possible.
- Clear signage will be in place to direct vehicles and pedestrians.
- Traffic barrels, fencing, and barriers will be in place to separate and secure work zones.
- Construction equipment and materials will be properly secured within the work zones.
- Traffic markings will be removed and painted on the roadway as required to guide motorists and cyclists.
- Work may be delayed due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.

About the project

- 15.6-kilometre subway line that will make it faster and easier to travel within Toronto and beyond.
- 15 stops and more than 40 connections to other transit, including GO train, subway, LRT, streetcar and bus lines.
- Approximately 30 minutes from one end of the line to the other.
- 28,000 fewer cars on the road each day.
