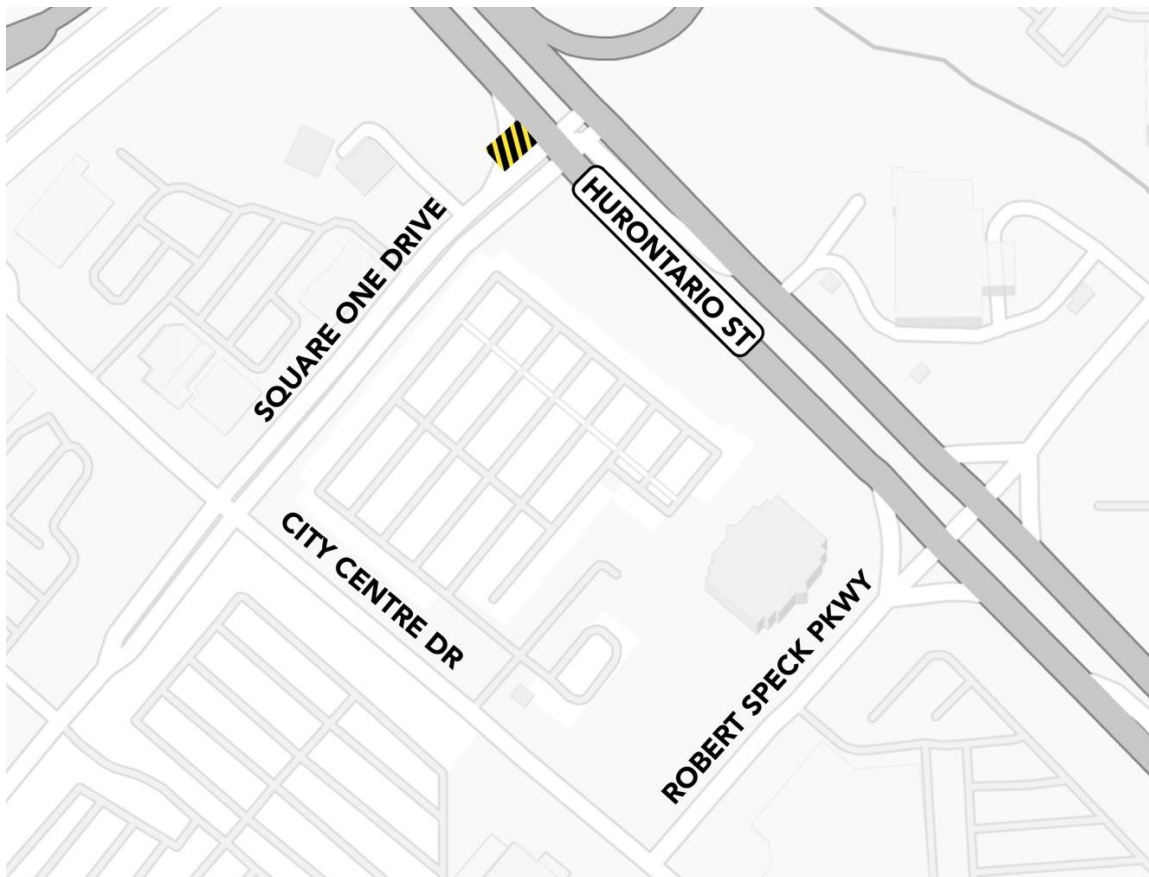


Guideway Intersection Installation at Square One Drive and Hurontario Street

UPDATE: Continuous Construction Works from 10pm on August 12 to 10pm on August 23



Project Overview

The Hazel McCallion Line project will be an 18-kilometre, 19-stop light rail service connecting people from the Port Credit GO station to the Brampton Gateway Terminal.

What You Need to Know

Crews will be welding tracks and doing concrete work for guideway installations within the intersection of Hurontario Street and Square One Drive. Work will begin on the north half of the intersection. When completed, crews will shift

staging over to the south half of the intersection. Work began on **Tuesday May 21, 2024 at 10pm, and is scheduled until Monday August 26, 2024 at 10pm.**

Construction work at this intersection is scheduled to take place from 7 a.m. – 10 p.m., seven days per week, until completion. Overnight work is required on the first day of each stage so crews can safely set up the staging for area. Access for emergency vehicles across Hurontario Street along Burnhamthorpe Road will be maintained. Traffic signal timings will be adjusted to keep people moving. Pedestrian crossings will be maintained at a signalized crosswalk. Please follow the signs installed to assist with navigating around the construction works.

UPDATE: Continuous construction works are scheduled for 10pm on August 12 to 10pm on August 23

To expedite construction, crews have been approved to work continuously. Construction is expected to take place primarily from 7am - 10pm, seven days per week.

Traffic signal timings will be adjusted to keep people moving. Pedestrian crossings will be maintained at a signalized crosswalk. Please follow the signs installed to assist with navigating around the closure. Please visit www.miway.ca/updates for updates on your bus route.

In accordance with City of Mississauga Noise By-Law Exemption requirements, this notice is meant to advise that residents near the work site can expect to hear noise and vibration caused by trucks, excavators, loaders, triaxles, backhoes, and other construction equipment related to this work.

Please note, work may be rescheduled due to weather or unforeseen circumstances. Please see roadway signage for the latest information. If you require the most up-to-date information, please reach out to peel@metrolinx.com and our team will provide you with e-updates of this work.

TIMING

- Intersection work is scheduled to begin May 21, 2024 until August 26, 2024
- Continuous construction will begin August 12 – August 23.
- Construction is scheduled to occur from 7 a.m. – 10 p.m., seven days per week.
- Work could be rescheduled and delayed due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.

TRAFFIC DETAILS

- Eastbound and westbound movements will be reduced to a single lane in each direction.
- Left turns at Burnhamthorpe Road and Hurontario Street will not be permitted.
- Additional lane reductions and turning restrictions will be in effect during weekend operations
- Traffic delays are expected.
- Watch for slow moving vehicles entering and exiting work areas.
- Remember to reduce your speed when approaching lane reductions.

WHAT TO EXPECT?

- Every effort will be made to minimize disruptions.

TRANSIT DETAILS

- Visit MiWay.ca for updates on your bus route.
- Watch for additional signs directing passengers at bus stops as boarding areas may be relocated.

PEDESTRIAN DETAILS

- Please take care when travelling near construction areas.
- Sidewalk access in the area could be affected.
- Watch for additional signs directing pedestrians as detours may be required.
- Clear and defined walking paths will be maintained during construction to ensure pedestrian safety.

PROPERTY DETAILS

- Crews will not require property access for this work.
