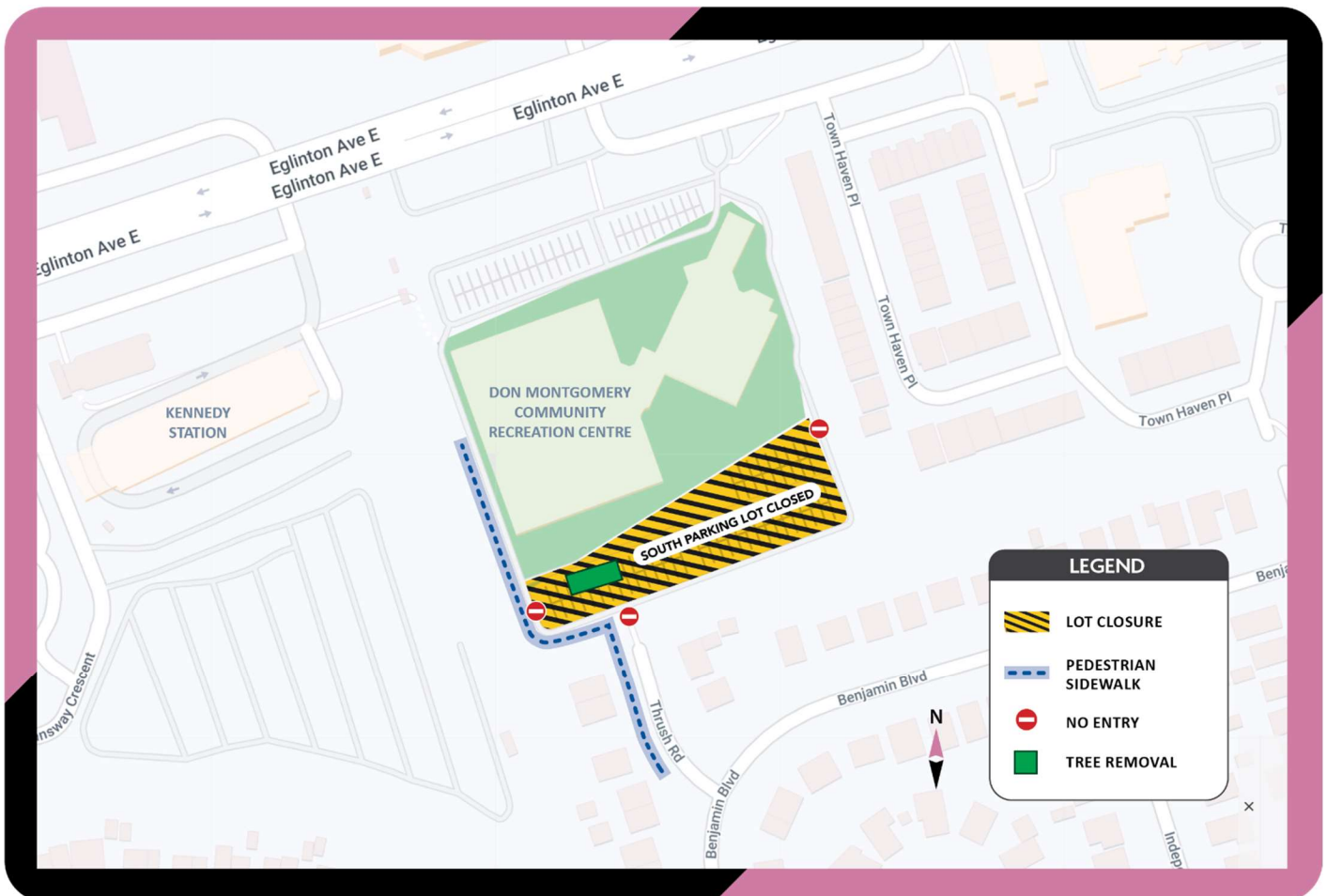


Don Montgomery Community Recreation Centre: South Parking Lot Closure and Tree Removals

Schedule: August 15 to Late October 2024

Note: all schedules are approximate and subject to change

Timing: Weekdays from 7 a.m. - 7 p.m.



What is Happening

- As part of continuing construction of the Scarborough Subway Extension at Kennedy station, there will be a temporary closure of the Don Montgomery Community Recreation Centre south parking lot.
- The reconfiguration work will include reorientation of the parking spaces to incorporate an underground utility channel and accessibility parking.
- Some tree removals are included in the scope of this work. All required permits have been obtained.
- Metrolinx works closely with the City of Toronto and the Toronto and Region Conservation Authority on replanting trees in the area. Learn more at metrolinx.com/vegetation.
- Metrolinx's Vegetation Guideline specifies how many trees need to be planted when any tree is removed, ranging from 1 to 50 new trees, based on the size and location of the tree being removed. This guideline is used across our network to ensure more trees are planted than removed as we carry out the largest transit expansion in the history of the region.

What to Expect

- For the duration of the work, the south parking lot will remain closed. Access to the north parking lot will remain open via Eglinton Ave East.
- Work areas will be clearly marked or fenced off as required to ensure public safety.
- Fencing will have a silt cloth, where possible, to help control dust and debris.
- Residents and businesses near the work site can expect to hear noise caused by excavators, trucks, and other construction equipment.
- There will be no impacts to traffic, including no lane or sidewalk closures.
- Pedestrian access to the Kennedy subway station and GO station will remain open.
- Within the fenced-off work zone, some equipment may be left on site for the duration of work and will be safely secured and stored when not in use.
- Work may be delayed due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.

About the Project

- A nearly eight-kilometre subway extension will extend Line 2 further into Scarborough.
- Three new stops will have connections to up to six other transit options including TTC buses, GO train, GO buses, the Eglinton Crosstown LRT, Durham Region Transit, and the proposed Sheppard Extension.
- The extension will accommodate up to 105,000 daily boardings and put 34,000 more jobs within walking distance to rapid transit.
