

Safety Moment - Heavy rainfall

Be prepared for torrential rain

- Intense rainfall is becoming more common and harder to predict
- Check the weather forecast frequently for potential rain and warnings
- Ensure storm drains near your house are clear and free of debris
- Have a general awareness of which areas are prone to flooding, such as in ravines, bodies of water, underpasses, or anywhere water collects easily.
- Avoid driving during a heavy rainfall. If already driving, do not drive through flooded areas.
- Inspect property for damage after a rainfall.



Noise and Vibration Update July 2024

Noise and Vibration Monitoring Update - July 2024



- There are four noise and vibration monitoring instruments located within the rail corridor, and seven monitors located at adjacent residential receptors
- There were three instances of complaints correlating with noise exceedances
- Most complaints were related to the paving work on Dundas that was required to improve road conditions for cyclists - this work could only be done at night because it required significant traffic closures
- No construction related vibration exceedances were detected
- Most exceedances were attributed to early morning work starts which were required to help protect workers from high heat temperatures
- Noise and vibration limits are measured at the property boundary

Poured 240 cubic metres of concrete for the abutment footing on the south side of the Queen bridge



Completed piling on the south side of the Queen and Dundas bridges - 24 piles drilled



Completed noise wall at Galt Ave and at 926 Gerrard (LCBO)



Completed structural support work (excavation and lagging) including:

- Installed 303 piles
- Built 3,800m2 of shoring wall
- Excavated 73,000 m3 of soil from the corridor

Bridge Abutment Construction


- With demolition work completed, the new bridge abutments are being built.
- Periodic traffic lane and sidewalk closures will be required; no road closures are expected.

Start dates and duration:

- Queen bridge: Ongoing for approximately two months.
- Dundas bridge: Ongoing for approximately two months.
- Logan bridge: Ongoing for approximately four months.


Hours of work:









Queen Street East: Weekend Road Closure

- Once the abutments are complete, the new bridge girder will be lifted into place and installed.
- Queen Street East will be closed over one weekend to complete the girder installation.
- The road will be closed between Broadview Ave. and Logan Ave. - access for local residents and businesses will be maintained.
- The TTC 501 Queen Streetcar will be replaced with buses from Thursday September 26 - Monday September 30, 2024


Hours of closure:

- Starting on Friday, September 27 at 9 p.m. until Monday, September 30, 2024, at 5 a.m.
- Work will take place on a 24-hour basis during the closure
- Mitigations measures will be in place to limit community disruption







Traffic Configuration: Queen Street East Bridge





Current Traffic Configuration: Dundas and Logan Bridges
















Construction Update: West Side of Rail Corridor

- As early November 2024, construction will begin on the west side of the rail corridor
- The first activities will be:
 - Tree removals and clearing and grubbing
 - Access road construction
 - Fence and retaining wall removals
- Exact start dates for these activities are still being determined
- The community will be provided with more details once specific timelines are confirmed



Access Roads



Construction of new access roads will begin in November 2024.

The existing access roads on the east side of the corridor will remain operational until November.

EARLY WORKS AND EASTERN AVENUE BRIDGE WORK

- Early Works may include such things as: establishing the work zone, moving equipment, supplies, and other resources, geo-technical investigations, utility daylighting, and track work.
- Early works are an important component of any construction project. These activities set the groundwork for major construction and reduce the risk of delays to the project downstream.
- Ongoing curb-lane closures on Eastern Avenue are in effect until October 2026*, to create a safe working zone for the crews and vehicle traffic.
- There will be road closures on Eastern Avenue between Broadview and Logan Avenues as highlighted below, to complete the bridge formwork and deck pour.


Pedestrian Sidewalk Closure: Temporary closure of the north pedestrian walkway between Lewis Street and Dibble Street will be in effect starting August 6, 2024, up until the weekend road closure on August 30.





Construction Liaison Committees (CLC)

Construction Liaison Committees (CLCs) provide open, two-way communication and sharing of information before and during the construction of the Ontario Line project. The CLC will focus on the impacts, issues and areas of concern for resolution related to the Ontario Line construction within the Leslieville/Riverside neighbourhoods. The full Terms of Reference will be shared with the CLC via email.

- The CLC will meet regularly as construction activities get underway
- CLC frequency is flexible, depending on schedules/availability and critical construction work

- Metrolinx to chair the CLC with support from the project contractor
- Project contractor will participate and lead the construction updates

Removal of existing and construction of new GO Bridges at Queen Street East, Dundas Street East and Logan Avenue. Construction of two new Ontario Line bridges at Dundas and Logan.



Realignment of the existing GO tracks, construction of a fourth GO track, and preparation works for eastbound and westbound Ontario Line tracks.
