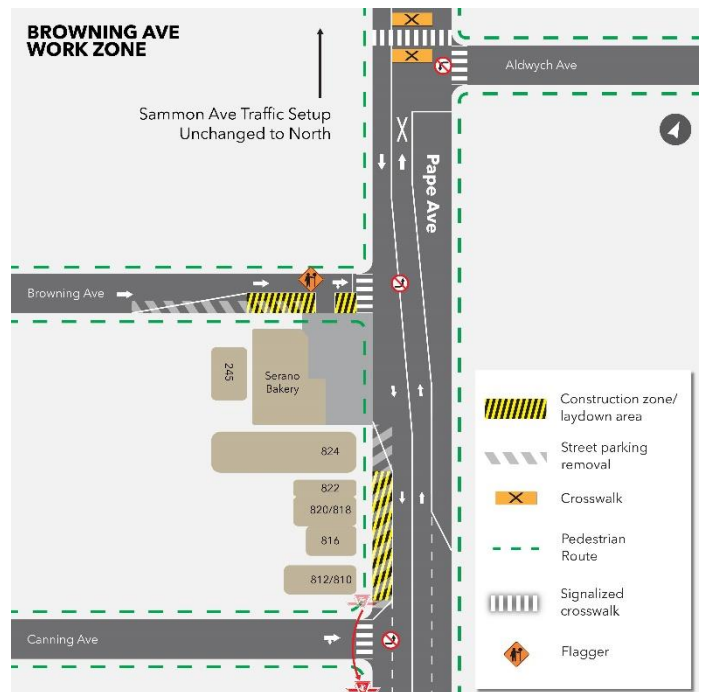
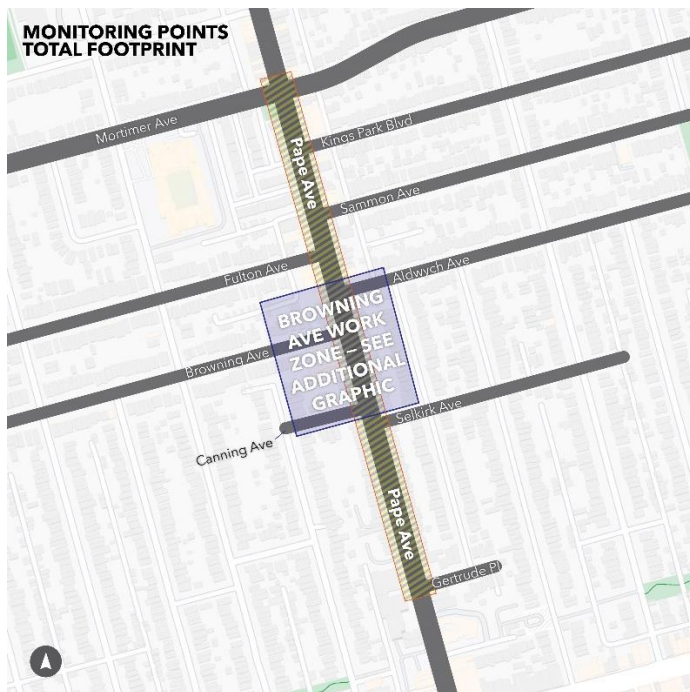


# Update: Groundwater Monitoring on Pape Ave Between Mortimer and Gertrude

**Expected dates:** August 24-29, September 6-7

**Hours of work:** August 15-19: 24 hours a day  
September 6-7: 9 p.m. – 5 a.m.



## What is happening?

- To support the design and construction of the Ontario Line, crews will be testing groundwater levels on Pape Ave between Mortimer Ave and Gertrude Pl.
- Work will take place on Pape Ave as well as on various side streets.

## What to expect

### Browning to Canning (Graphic "Browning Ave Work Zone")

- Work will take place 24 hours a day between August 24-29.
- Crews will occupy work zones on Browning Ave and Pape Ave.
- Equipment used will include trucks, water hauling trucks, and hand tools.

- Nearby residents and businesses can expect minimal noise caused by trucks and equipment.
- All vehicular access will be maintained, and no driveways will be blocked.
- A flag person and paid-duty officer will be on-site through the duration of work to maintain safety for pedestrians and vehicular traffic.
- Pylons and barricades will be set up to provide separation for pedestrians, cyclists, and traffic.
- Seven street parking spots will be temporarily removed on Browning Ave.
- The TTC bus stop on the northwest corner of Pape and Canning will be shifted south of the intersection to move it away from the work zone.
- Left turns will not be permitted from side streets near the work zone.

**Mortimer to Browning & Canning to Gertrude** (Graphic “Monitoring Points Total Footprint”)

- Work will take place between September 6-7 from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m.
- Crews will perform short-term lane occupancies at various already-installed monitoring wells along Pape to collect water level information.
- Hand tools will be used to access the monitoring wells.
- 1-2 street parking spots will be temporarily occupied while crews check each well.
- All vehicular access will be maintained, and no driveways will be blocked.
- A flagger will be on-site throughout work to maintain pedestrian safety and vehicle traffic.
- Pylons and barricades will be set up to provide separation for pedestrians, cyclists, and traffic.

**Note:**

- All necessary construction permits have been obtained.
- Work may be postponed or rescheduled due to unforeseen circumstances.
