
Tower crane installation at Ordnance Triangle Park emergency exit building (EEB)

Expected start date: As early as Wednesday, October 1, 2024

Duration: Until Saturday, October 3, 2024

Hours of work: 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., with possibility of extension to 7:00 p.m.

What is happening?

- As part of ongoing construction of the Ontario Line and the future Ordnance Triangle Park emergency exit building (EEB), crews will be installing a tower crane at the site on the far east end of the park, which will help support future excavation. The installation will occur over a 3-day period.
- To install the overhead crane, a flatbed truck will deliver the tower and mast components to the work site, starting on Wednesday, October 1, 2024. The truck will travel north on Strachan Avenue from Lakeshore Boulevard and enter the Metrolinx access road north of Ordnance Street.
- Crews will take measures to minimize noise impacts wherever possible.
- Work hours for the crane installation will take place between 7:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. and may be extended to 7:00 p.m. if needed.
- To reduce impacts to residents and businesses in the area, there will be no overnight works to install the crane.

What to expect?

- The crane will be assembled on-site. The delivery requires traffic control persons to guide a flatbed truck to the site via the Metrolinx access road north of Ordnance Street, east of Strachan Avenue, and parallel to the rail corridor.
- The work zone at the east end of the Ordnance Triangle has been fenced off and is inaccessible to the public. The park and trails crossing over the rail corridors will be unaffected remain open during excavation.
- Residents can continue to walk, cycle and use the parks accordingly.
- The work has been sequenced to minimize noise and assemble the crane and shed in as little time as possible.

About the Ontario Line

- 15.6-kilometre subway line that will make it faster and easier to travel within Toronto and beyond.
- 15 stops and more than 40 connections to other transit, including GO train, subway, LRT, streetcar, and bus lines.
