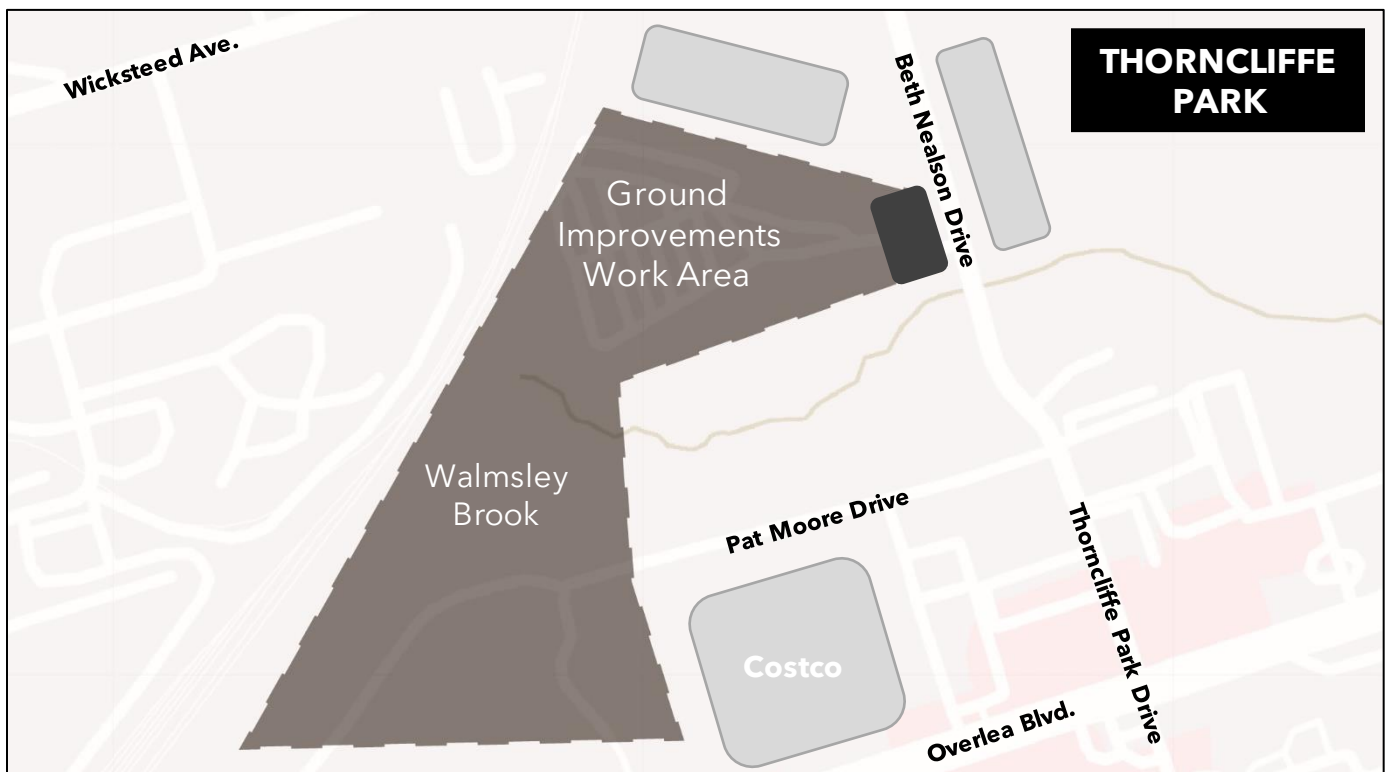


Early Works continue near CP Rail tracks and 40 Beth Neelson Drive

Start date: Spring 2024

Expected duration: up to Winter 2025

What is happening?

- Metrolinx began construction activities in the northern section of the Ontario Line this past spring, and early works will continue through the fall and winter, to prepare for the construction of the Ontario Line Operations, Maintenance and Storage Facility (OMSF).
- The works will take place in multiple areas.

Walmsley Brook Culvert

- Work continues across the embankment to support enabling works for the future OMSF and to construct a new culvert underneath the CP tracks.
- A launch and extraction shaft has been completed, and the micro tunnel boring machine has finished digging the tunnel beneath the tracks.
- Community members can expect to see construction crews with trucks and other heavy construction entering and exiting the various sites.

Road Construction and Site Decontamination

- In April, early prep works began near 40 Beth Neilson Drive and a temporary road construction will continue adjacent to Pat Moore Drive.
- To enable easy access to the site, without impeding local traffic, a temporary road was constructed adjacent to the CP tracks behind 2 Thorncliffe Park Drive, for the use of the construction team.
- Throughout the ravine and hydro corridor, well decommissioning continues.

Ground Improvements

- Beginning in early October, crews will be on site near 40 Beth Neilson, to begin ground improvements to support the Operations, Maintenance and Storage Facility.
- Improvements to the soil conditions are needed to ensure it meets the requirements for construction, providing long-term stability and optimal performance.
- A technique using Controlled Modulus Columns will be used to support the future OMSF, by installing vertical concrete columns to enhance the soil stiffness and increase its load-capacity.

What to expect

- Noise and pedestrian or traffic impacts associated with this work are not anticipated.
- Sidewalk access and vehicular road traffic will be maintained.
- All the necessary permits have been obtained.
- Work may be postponed or rescheduled due to weather or unforeseen circumstances.

About the Ontario Line

- 15.6-kilometre subway line that will make it faster and easier to travel within Toronto and beyond.
- 15 stops and more than 40 connections to other transit, including GO train, subway, LRT, streetcar, and bus lines.
- Less than 30 minutes from one end of the line to the other.
- 28,000 fewer cars on the road each day.
