What is happening?

Lane Reduction - Minton Place & Hopedale Avenue

- On November 11, the curb lane adjacent to the site on Hopedale Avenue will be occupied. Two lanes of traffic will be maintained on Hopedale Avenue. The sidewalk adjacent to the closure will be closed in addition to the closure on the east side of Minton Place.
- Traffic control personnel will be present on Minton Place and Hopedale Avenue to direct traffic and traffic signage will be posted around work area.
- Local traffic will have right-of-way over construction vehicles.
- To safely carry out work and ensure public safety, fencing and concrete barriers will be installed as shown in map above.

- The lane closures are expected to stay in place until June 2027.

What to Expect

- The lane closure on Hopedale is scheduled to begin as early as November 11, 2024. Fast fencing will be installed and later replaced with temporary concrete barriers and hoarding.
- Limited street parking space will be available on Minton Place and Hopedale Avenue.
- No vehicular through traffic will be available on the east side of Hopedale Avenue and Minton Place. Detour signs will be installed to reroute motorists accordingly. Pedestrians and cyclist bi-directional traffic will be allowed and managed by traffic personnel.
- An increase in construction traffic entering and exiting the work area, primarily from Minton Place.
- There will be no impact on TTC bus or subway service because of this work.
- All efforts will be made to mitigate impacts to the local community, motorists, pedestrians, and cyclists.
- For vehicles exiting driveways on Minton Place north of Hopedale Avenue, Metrolinx has worked with our constructor to ensure that personal vehicles will have sufficient turn radius to exit their driveways. - 15.6-kilometre subway line that will make it faster and easier to travel within Toronto and beyond.
