Update: Headwall construction


Start date: Ongoing since August 2024

End date: Early December 2024

Hours of work: Increasing as of October 26, 2024

Monday to Friday 24 hours a day, Saturday from 6:00 a.m. to 2:00 a.m., and Sunday from 6:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. occasionally extending until 2:00 a.m.

Note: all schedules are approximate and subject to change



What is happening?

- In August 2024, crews began construction of a headwall just south of Highway 401.
- Work schedules will be increasing, and will include weekend and overnight construction activities.
- The work is located by the ramp east of McCowan Road and south of Highway 401, as shown on the map above.

What to expect?

- As of October 26, work will take place Monday to Friday 24 hours a day, Saturdays from 6:00 a.m. to 2:00 a.m., and Sundays 6:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. with work occasionally extending until 2:00 a.m.
- Expect noise from the construction equipment being used on site, which will include a frontend loader, a piling rig, cement trucks, dump trucks and other machinery to facilitate the piling works. Traffic barrels, fencing and barriers are in place to separate and secure work zones.
- To ensure pedestrian and driver safety, construction crews will temporarily close traffic lanes and sidewalks along McCowan Road occasionally. Signage will be in place to alert drivers and pedestrians regarding these temporary closures and detours.
- Work may be delayed or rescheduled due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.

About the project

- A nearly eight-kilometre subway extension will extend Line 2 further into Scarborough.
- Three new stops will have connections to up to six other transit options including TTC buses, GO train, GO buses, the Eglinton Crosstown LRT, Durham Region Transit, and the proposed Sheppard Extension.
- The extension will accommodate up to 105,000 daily boardings and put 34,000 more jobs within walking distance to rapid transit.
