
# In-ground Monitoring Point Installations on Lipton Avenue

Expected start date: As early as January 29, 2024

**Expected completion date:** February, 2024 **Timing:** Monday to Friday, 7:00 p.m. to 5 a.m.



Areas within the dotted red lines show where monitoring points will be installed for this work.

## What is happening?

- As early as January 15, crews will begin installing in-ground geotechnical monitoring points overnight on Lipton Avenue.
- During the week of January 22, crews will also be installing in-ground geotechnical monitoring points from 7 PM to 9 PM on Pape Avenue.
- These points will be used to monitor underground utilities and groundwater levels during Ontario Line construction.
- Monitoring points will be installed in-ground within the roadway and sidewalks in the areas shown above in red.
- All necessary permits have been obtained and works will be monitored by Metrolinx representatives to ensure compliance.

### What to expect

- Crews will be installing in-ground monitoring points on Lipton Avenue, Pape Avenue outside of Pape Station, and Danforth Avenue.
- Monitoring point installation will involve the use of hand tools, a mobile drill, a coring truck, and a hydro-vac excavator.
- Work will take place during evenings and overnight to reduce impacts on bus movements around the station.
- Short-term single-lane closures will be required. Flaggers will be on site to direct traffic around closures.
- Following monitoring point installation, crews will be visiting each monitoring point on a bi-weekly basis to gather data until summer 2024.
- A paid-duty officer will be on site as required.
- Work will require crews to occupy street parking spots. "No Parking" signs will be posted as required a minimum of one day in advance.
- Residents may experience noise from work equipment.
- Work may be delayed or rescheduled due to inclement weather or unforeseen circumstances.
