


Beanfield Cable Removal

Expected Start Date: As early as December 16, 2024 **Expected Duration:** Approximately four (4) weeks **Hours of work:** Overnight on Weekdays, 7 p.m. to 7 a.m.







Southbound curb lane occupancies will occur one at a time and have a traffic control plan, similar to the plan pictured above.

What is Happening?

- As part of the utility relocation works taking place near Pape Avenue and Riverdale Avenue for the Ontario Line, a crew from Beanfield will mobilize as early as Monday, December 16, 2024, to conduct cable removals.
- This work will be completed in two phases, the first phase will take approximately four (4) weeks to complete.
 - For the first phase, work will be completed through temporary occupancies of the southbound curb lane on Pape Avenue from Hazelwood Avenue to the entrance of 449 Carlaw, as well as at Pape Avenue and Gerrard Street East.
 - The periodic occupancies will occur near telecommunications manholes.
 - The second phase of work will begin mid-January 2025. A notice outlining the work will be distributed closer to the start date.
- The occupied curbside lane will be closed during nighttime hours.

What to expect

Construction

- Work will involve the use of cube vans, pick-up trucks, reel trailers, and may involve the use of an excavator to install cables below the ground. This is a requirement to safely protect existing utility infrastructure.
- Residents and businesses in the area may hear noise caused by work equipment. Crews will take measures to minimize noise impacts wherever possible.
- Work may be delayed due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.

Traffic and Pedestrian Details

- All pedestrian pathways will remain open throughout the work.
- The occupied curbside lane will be closed during nighttime hours.

Safety

- Signage will be posted around the site to direct pedestrians.
- Equipment may be left on site but will be properly secured and stored to ensure safety.
