
UPDATED: Overhead crane installation at King-Bathurst Station

Expected start date: As early as December 8, 2024.

Expected duration: Two (2) overnight installation dates, December 8 and 9, 2024.

Hours of work: Overnight from 11:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m.

Map of work area: What is happening?



As part of ongoing construction for the future Ontario Line and the future King-Bathurst station, crews will install an overhead crane inside the north site acoustic shelter. The crane will support equipment to be raised and lowered in the excavated shaft and to remove excavated soil.

To complete the installation of the overhead crane, steel girders will be delivered to site and installed overnight on Sunday, December 8 and Monday December 9.

A temporary crane truck is already on-site to assist with the installation. The delivery of the overhead crane components requires traffic control persons to safely guide the equipment into the site, while maintaining safe operations and passage for vehicles and pedestrians on King Street West.

What to expect

- Steel girders and an overhead crane will be delivered to the north station site.
- The crane and girders delivery will take place over two consecutive nights and may require a short-term closure of the sidewalk on the north side of King Street West, while the equipment is being delivered to the worksite. These operations will be supported by traffic control persons who will guide pedestrians and cyclists safely.
- This specialized equipment will arrive on oversized flatbed trucks requiring special permits.
 To reduce traffic impacts on King St and Bathurst St the delivery will be made in the overnight period.
- Unloading, assembly and installation of girders and the overhead crane will be done entirely within the acoustic shelter.
- Residents may expect some noise on-site assembly equipment and from vehicle back up alarms. Some welding will take place on-site as part of the overhead crane assembly.
- Testing and final commissioning of the overhead crane within the acoustic shelter.
- Work schedules may be adjusted or postponed due to unforeseen or weather-related circumstances.
