

Overhead Utility Relocation at Deviation Rd.

January 20th, 2024-June 30th, 2025 from 7AM-6PM Monday-Friday

Project Overview:

GO service is expanding to serve you better - with more frequent service, more stations, cleaner technology, and more connections.

Across the entire network, our goal is to deliver over 10,000 train trips a week - so you will not need a schedule because you know the next train will be coming soon.

What do you need to know?

Crews will be mobilizing to take overhead utility wires and transfer them underground. This will allow the removal of any conflicts of overhead cables running over the Barrie corridor for future support of electrification.

What does this mean for you?

There will be a partial closure at Old Main/Deviation Road on the East side of the bike/pedestrian pathway. Crews will be working within the city right-of-way, and there will be signage set up to notify residents of the slight detour along the pathway where equipment will be stored. Residents may hear some drilling and excavating noise during the working times caused by the excavator and horizontal directional drill (HDD). Pedestrians/cyclists at Nokiida/Tom Taylor bike trail will be unable to access the area during the specific active drilling.
