

Traffic diversion at Queen Street and Victoria Street intersection

Expected start date: As early as January 7, 2025

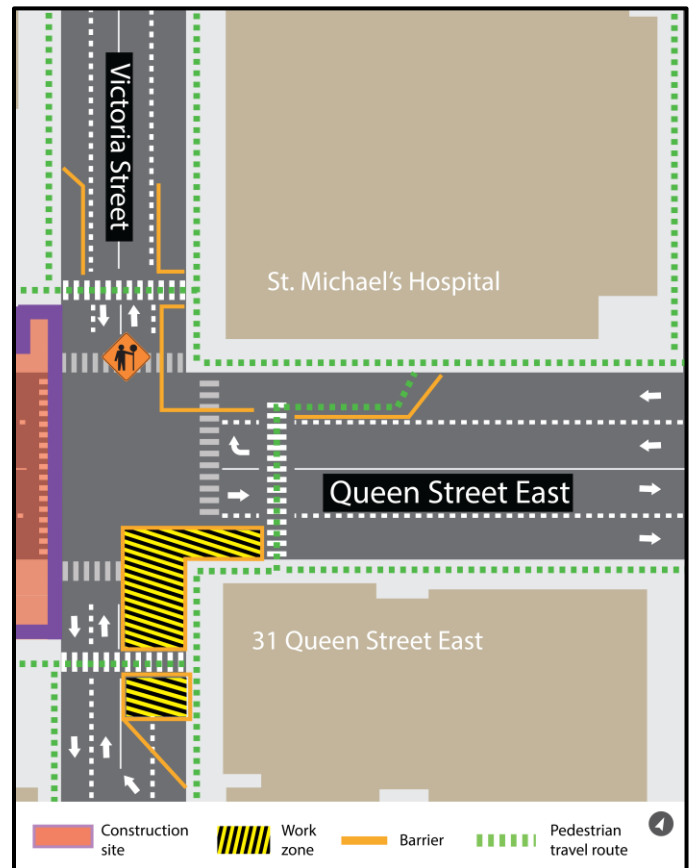
Work hours: Daytime from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

Expected duration: Intermittent lane closures, up to January 18, 2025

What is happening?

Construction is underway for the Ontario Line station at Queen. To allow for the continuation of the piling works, some utilities work must be performed near the site. Crews require access to the two lanes at the intersection of Queen Street and Victoria Street as shown on the map.

- To ensure safe passage around the work zone during these works, a traffic diversion will be implemented as follows:
 - Northbound on Victoria Street:** Traffic will merge into one lane, following signage posted.
 - Southbound on Victoria Street:** Traffic will merge into one lane, following signage posted.
 - Queen Street:** Traffic will be able to turn onto Queen Street East from both the southbound and northbound lanes.
- Pedestrian routes are accessible in all directions as shown in the map. The crosswalk at the West of the intersection of Queen and Victoria Street will remain closed.
- The traffic diversions will be intermittently implemented from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.



What to expect

- As early as January 7, 2025, work will begin to implement a traffic diversion at the intersection of Victoria and Queen Street. Traffic will be detoured around the work zone.
- Crews will work from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.
- This diversion will be in effect up to January 18, 2025.
- Traffic signage will be in place along the work zone to direct pedestrians in the area.
- A flag person will ensure safe access to traffic in the north and south intersections.
- Paid duty officers will be on site to ensure the safety of vehicles and pedestrians.
- All necessary construction permits will be in place prior to the commencement of the work.

Note:

- Work may be delayed, rescheduled, or extended due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.
