

Update: Sewer connection at Queen Street West and Spadina Avenue

Expected start date: Work in progress, since early December

Expected duration: Through mid-February, 2025

Hours of work: Weekdays from 7:00 A.M. to 7:00 P.M.

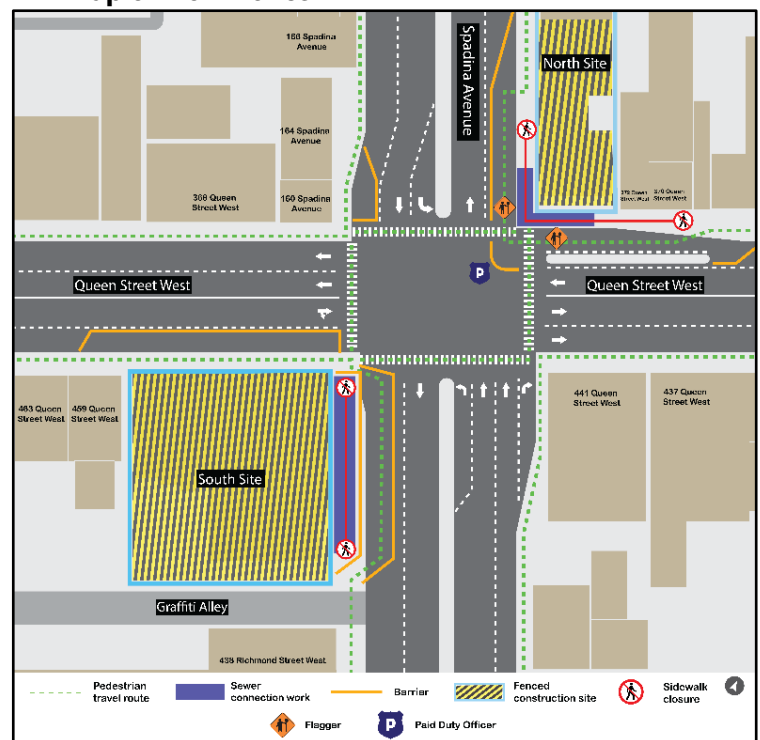
What is happening?

As part of construction for the future Ontario Line station at Queen Street West and Spadina Avenue, crews are conducting work to complete city sewer connections at both sites. This work is done by accessing sewer manholes to connect the Ontario Line site sewer to the main system.

- **At the South site:** Crews will drill into the sidewalk on Spadina Avenue to connect the line, as indicated on the map. At times, pedestrians will be detoured around the work.
- **At the North site:** Crews will drill into the sidewalk on Queen Street West to connect the line, as indicated on the map. At times, pedestrians will be detoured around the work.

This work is expected to be completed by January 25, 2025.

What to expect

- At the South site:
 - The southbound curb lane on Spadina Ave will be temporarily closed to traffic while crews are working. Pedestrians will be safely detoured along the work zone when required.
- At the North site:
 - The westbound curb lane on Queen St West and northbound curb lane on Spadina Ave will be closed between 9:00 A.M. and 4:00 P.M. to facilitate a safe work zone. It will be re-opened to traffic outside of these hours.
 - When the traffic lane is closed, the sidewalk on the north side of Queen St West and the east side of Spadina Ave, adjacent to the site, will be closed while this work takes place, and pedestrians will be safely be detoured.

- Work to connect the north site is expected to be completed by January 25, 2025. Work at the south site will then begin and is anticipated to be completed by **mid-February 2025**.
- This work will take place between 7:00 A.M. to 7:00 P.M. and shifts may be intermittently scheduled. Additional work hours, including overnight, may be added as required to complete this task.
- Area residents and businesses can expect to hear noise from work equipment, specifically hydrovac, trucks and saw cutting tools as required. The use of hydrovac trucks are required for the safety of both infrastructure and crew. Crews will take measures to minimize noise impacts wherever possible.
- Traffic barrels and barriers will be in place to separate and secure work zones for pedestrian safety, where required.
- Paid-duty officers or flag-personnel may be on site to ensure the safety of pedestrians.
- Work may be postponed or rescheduled due to unforeseen circumstances.
- All necessary construction permits have been obtained.
