

Traffic light relocation at Queen Street East and Victoria Street

Expected start date: As early as February 3, 2025

Duration: up to two (2) nights

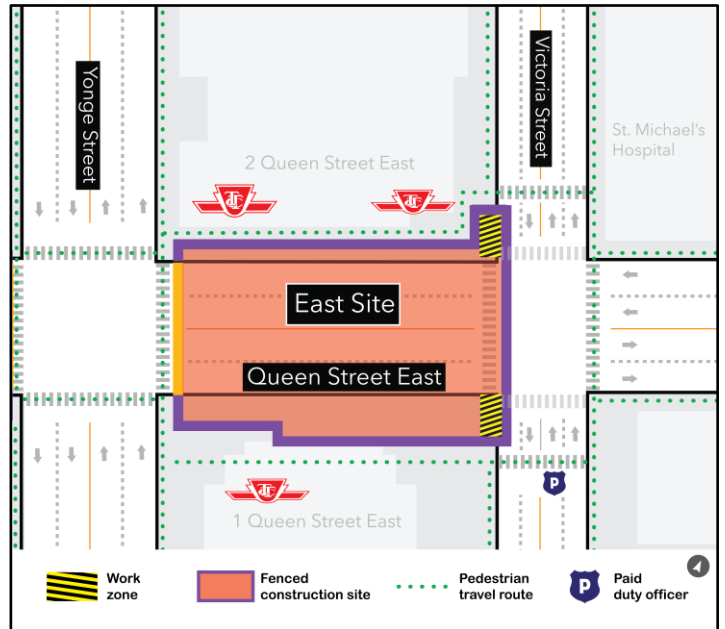
Hours of work: Overnight from 7:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m.

What is happening?

Construction is under way for the Ontario Line station at Queen. To allow for the continuation of the construction of the future station site, utilities work must be performed near the site.

Crews will be removing and replacing two (2) traffic light posts at the intersection of Queen Street East and Victoria Street, as shown on the map.

Pedestrian passage will be accessible as shown in the map. The westbound cross walk at Queen Street East and Victoria Street will remain closed. Occasional traffic diversion around the work site may be implemented from 7:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m.



What to expect

As early as February 3, 2025, work will begin to relocate traffic posts at the intersection of Victoria Street and Queen Street East.

- Most of the work will take place within the existing work zone, however, some impact to traffic and the traffic lights is expected while relocation works are ongoing.
- Noise from hydrovac trucks is expected during work hours; this type of machinery is required during utilities work to maintain safety.
- Lane and sidewalk closures may be in place intermittently during this timeframe.
- Traffic signage will be in place along the work zone to direct pedestrians in the area.
- Paid Duty Officers will be on site to ensure the safety of vehicles and pedestrians.
- All necessary construction permits will be in place prior to the commencement of the work.

Note:

- Work may be delayed, rescheduled, or extended due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.
