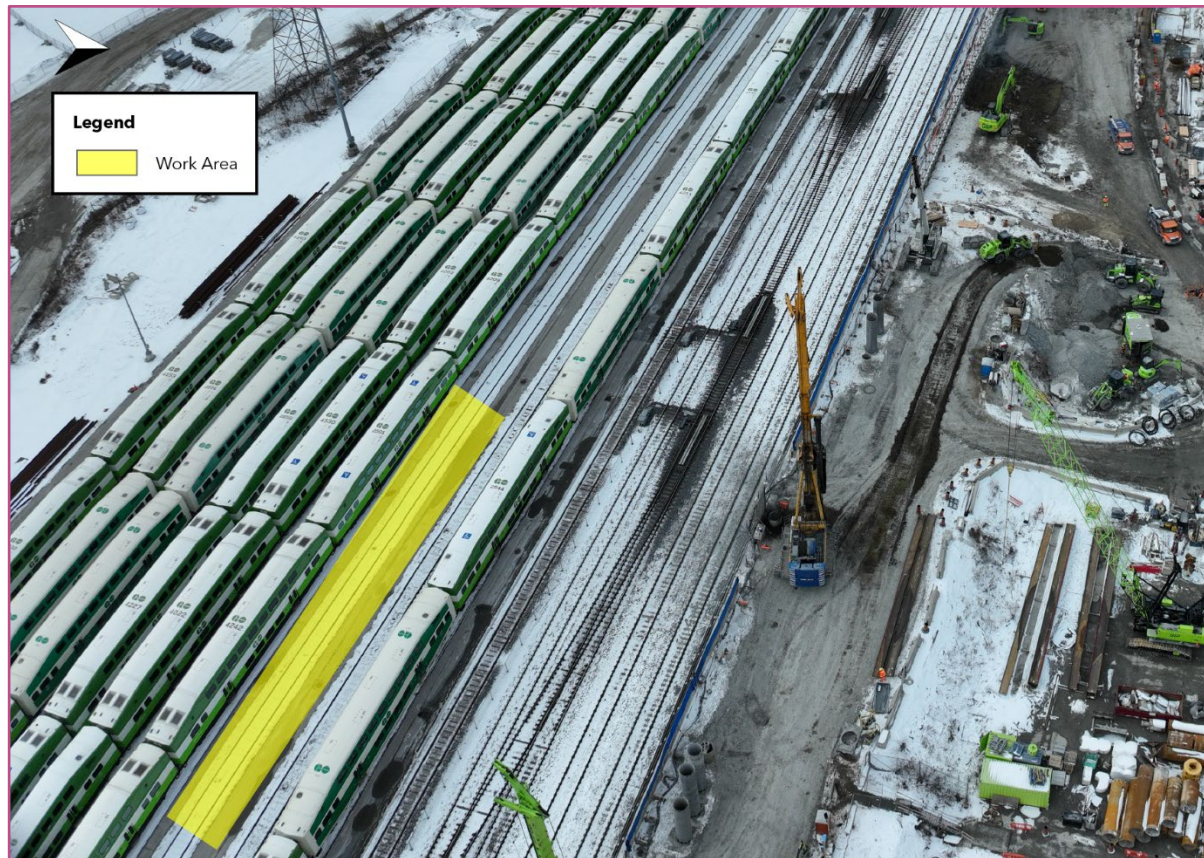


Overnight weekend work in the Don Yard rail corridor

Dates and hours of work : Starting Friday March 21 at 9 p.m. until Monday March 24, 2025 at 5 a.m.



What is happening?

- Starting on Friday March 21 at 9 p.m. until Monday, March 24, 2025, at 5 a.m. overnight work will take place in the Don Yard rail corridor to install new train tracks.
- The Lakeshore East rail corridor will be closed to safely complete this work. GO train service will be affected. For more details, please see the **Transit information** section below.
- This work can only be performed safely when trains are not operating in the rail corridor.
- Overnight work is required to ensure all necessary activities are completed over the weekend within the approved closure period.
- No traffic or pedestrian impacts are expected as a result of this work.

What to expect

- Over the weekend, crews will work to remove a track switch and old rail. New rail will then be installed.
- These activities are required to make sure the tracks are in good condition and will improve the reliability of trains by avoiding the need for future maintenance work.
- Track work will be continuous between Friday 9 p.m. to Monday 5 a.m.
- Minor noise is expected - crews will do their best to limit noisy work overnight.
- Trucks will enter and exit the site from Mill Street.
- Other construction activities, including piling, jet grouting, excavation, and hauling, will continue during regular work hours.

- Noise, vibration, and air quality monitoring are in place to ensure acceptable levels are maintained.
- Construction equipment and materials will be properly secured within the work zone.
- Work may be delayed or rescheduled due to inclement weather and/or unforeseen circumstances.

Transit information

- Starting late night Friday, March 21, and throughout the March 22-23 weekend, Lakeshore East train service will be replaced by GO buses between the Union Station Bus Terminal and Pickering GO Station. Trains will operate every 30 minutes between Pickering GO Station and Durham College Oshawa GO Station. Replacement buses will run directly between Union Station Bus Terminal and Pickering GO Station.
- There will be no GO Transit service at Danforth, Scarborough, Eglinton, Guildwood or Rouge Hill GO stations. Customers will be directed to use other GO stations or TTC alternatives.
