
## Lakeshore East Rail Corridor: Weekly In-Corridor Work Update

**Update for the weeks of:** Saturday, March 15 to Saturday, March 29, 2025 **Hours of work:** 

- Daytime: Monday- Friday, with occasional weekend work, from 7 a.m.- 7 p.m.
- Overnight: Monday Sunday from 8 p.m.- 5 a.m. (nights of work depend on activity further details below).



This notice provides an update on the work happening in the rail corridor over the next two (2) weeks. It is updated every Friday.

## What is happening?

Construction work is underway in the Lakeshore East rail corridor to prepare for the future Ontario Line. This notice provides a progress update on the works taking place in the rail corridor. The Contractor will be moving equipment and machinery throughout the rail corridor to access each work area and stockpile materials. The Contractor will enter the rail corridor from the access road at Eastern Avenue. Certain construction activities may cause noise and vibration at nearby properties. For further details, please carefully review the information provided in the table below.

Track work  Delivering and stockpiling tracks in the rail corridor and welding new tracks together.  Backfilling, laying and grading material (crushed stone) underneath the tracks. Levelling the tracks with surfacing equipment.		
	Monday March 17 - Friday March 21, 2025	Logan bridge	Formwork removal Removal of timber and steel forms from the Logan bridge.		
•	Starting Friday March 21 at 7 p.m. to Monday March 24 at 5 a.m.	Within the rail corridor from Queen Street East to Jones Avenue.	Track Relocation Work (Weekend Rail Corridor Closure) Shifting tracks from the west to the east side of the rail corridor. Building new rail, backfilling ballast (crushed stone), and surfacing the new tracks. The Lakeshore East rail corridor will be closed to safety complete this work. GO train service will be affected. •	Monday March 17 - Friday March 28, 2025 (weekdays)	In certain locations along the west side of the Lakeshore East rail corridor between Eastern Ave. and Pape Ave.	Tree and vegetation removals and pruning Removal and pruning of trees and shrubs, as well as clearing and grubbing.  Vegetation removal will continue until March 31, 2025, to make way for infrastructure enhancements including new retaining walls and noise barriers.		
	Monday March 17 - Friday March 28, 2025 (weekdays)	Queen bridge	Formwork installations Installing timber and steel forms on top of the Queen bridge to prepare for concrete pours.		
•	Monday March 17 - Friday March 28, 2025 (weekdays)	Within the rail corridor north and south of the Queen Street bridge  *Piling will shift to the south side of the Queen bridge (opposite Strange St.) on March 24.	Secant Piling at Queen bridge Drilling piles for the future Riverside-Leslieville Station. A drill rig will be used to complete this work.		
•	Saturday, March 15 to Saturday, March 29, 2025 (weekdays and weekends)	Within the rail corridor between Eastern Ave. and Jones Ave.	Track work  Delivering and stockpiling tracks in the rail Corridor and welding new tracks together. Grading and levelling the tracks using surfacing equipment.		
•	Friday March 21 - Friday March 28, 2025	Within the rail corridor north of the Queen bridge, across from De Grassi St.	Excavation and tieback installation Excavating the embankment within the rail corridor to prepare for retaining wall construction.  **Prior to the excavation work, the noise barrier at the top of the rail corridor will be removed. This work will happen overnight on Thurs March 20.		

## What to Expect

- Overnight work is required to complete activities that construction crews cannot do safely while trains are active and running in the corridor.
- Noise from trucks and equipment entering the rail corridor at Eastern Avenue.
- Excavators, trucks, compactors, loaders, skid steers, and mobile cranes will be used to complete daytime work activities.
- Residents in nearby properties may experience noise and vibration from the work; monitoring is in place to ensure levels stay within acceptable limits.
- Various mitigation measures will be implanted to reduce disruption.
- Overnight site lighting will be positioned downward into the rail corridor and away from residential properties.
- Construction equipment and materials will be secured within the work zones.
- Work may be rescheduled due to inclement weather and/or unforeseen circumstances.
- Work locations are subject to change and may vary based on site conditions and/or schedule requirements.
