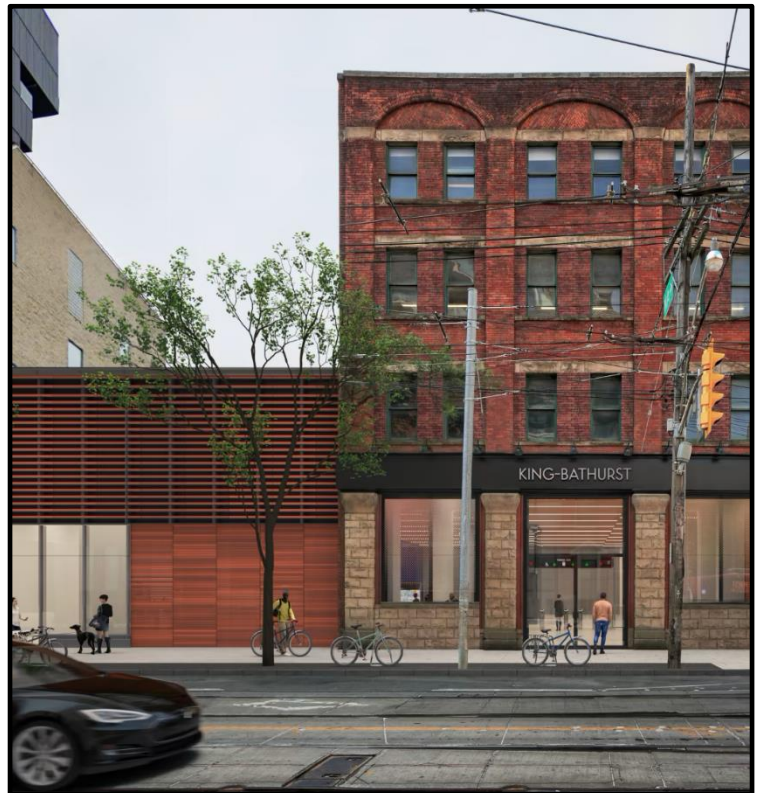
What is happening?

King-Bathurst Construction Update

Ontario Line subway construction crews are working to build a new subway station at King-Bathurst. At both the King-Bathurst north and south construction sites, excavation of the station cavern continues.

Crews will connect the station shafts, which will act as the access points for passengers to get to the Ontario Line trains, to the future station platform area. Cavern excavation will occur in a southwest direction, moving away from at the northeast corner of King Street West and Bathurst Street.

This cavern also creates space for the future tunnel boring machines as they create the Ontario Line subway tunnels through downtown Toronto.

What to expect

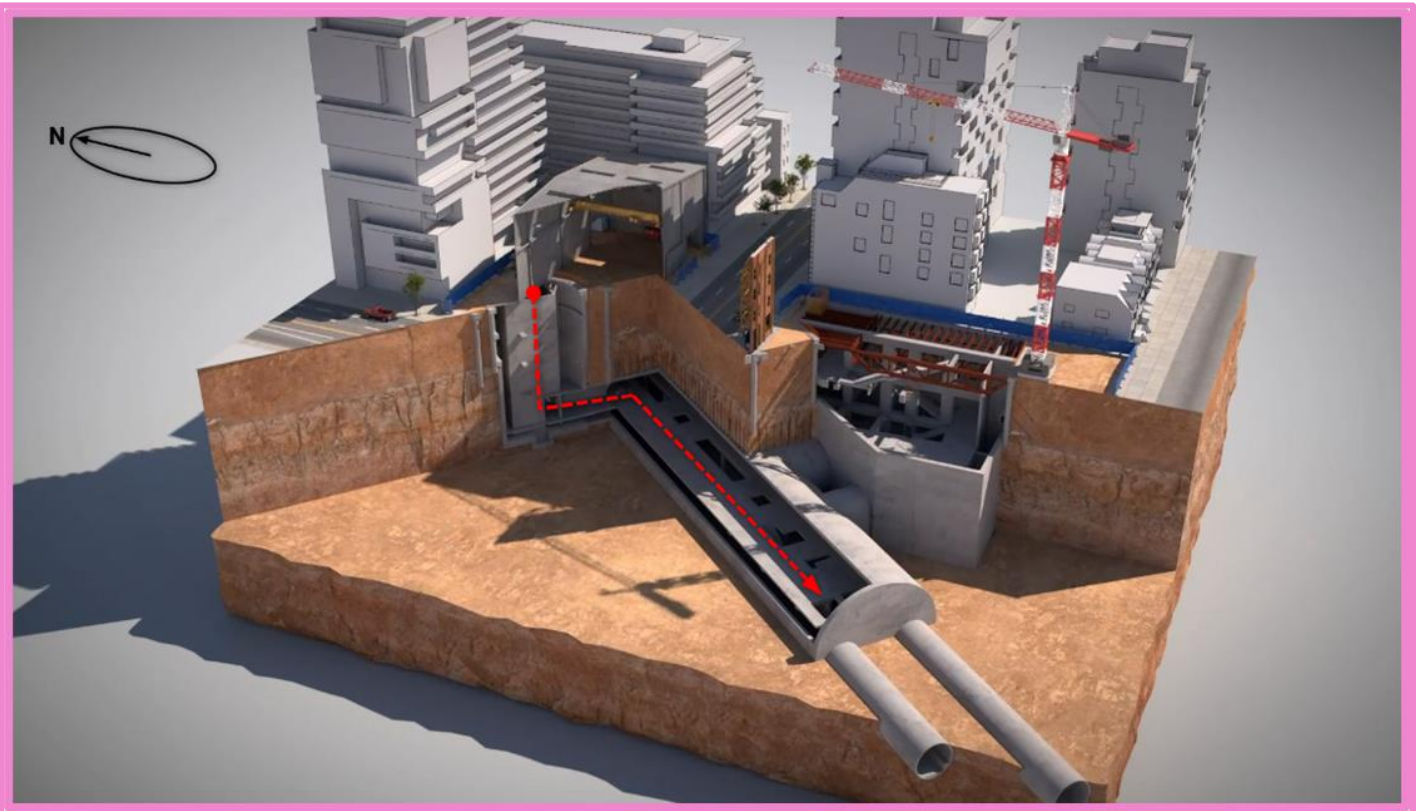


Diagram of the King-Bathurst cavern location and excavation direction.

- Cavern excavation is an essential step in creating a new space for the station subway platform.
- Rock spoils will continue to be raised out of the shaft and transported away using dump trucks, following specified haul routes. Traffic control persons will guide vehicles, pedestrians and cyclists as needed, as vehicles enter and exit the sites.
- Due to the nature of the work, crews at the north site continue to work on a 24-hour rotation to excavate the station cavern. This methodology keeps crews safe and ensures excavation support. Specialized equipment known as roadheader, rock bolters and shotcrete machines are in use to perform excavation activities. Noise and vibration from the equipment will be monitored as the machine moves away from the site.
- To reduce impacts to residents and businesses in the area, mitigations are in place including air quality, noise and vibration monitoring, street cleaning, an acoustic shelter, site hoarding, additional paved areas, sprinkler systems and mud mats for dust suppression.

About the Ontario Line

- 15.6-kilometre subway line that will make it faster and easier to travel within Toronto and beyond.
- 15 stops and over 40 connections to other transit, including GO train, subway, LRT, streetcar, and bus lines.
- Less than 30 minutes from one end of the line to the other.
- 28,000 fewer car trips each day.
