

Installation of monitoring devices: Queen Street East and Yonge Street

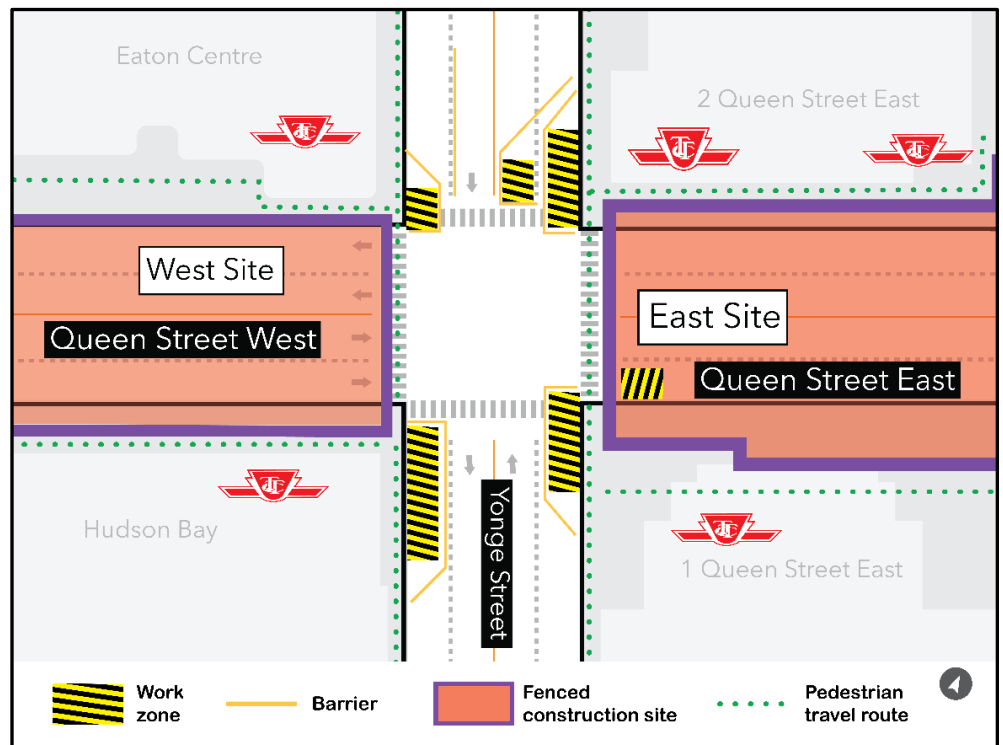
Expected start date: As early as April 1, 2025

Expected duration: Up to 3 weeks

Hours of work: Overnight (Monday-Friday), between 9:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m.

What is happening?

- Crews are installing monitors and investigating utilities around **Queen Street East** and **Yonge Street** as indicated in the areas shown in yellow on the map, to support Ontario Line construction work.
- Devices are installed to monitor the area around utilities during construction.
- They will be installed underground and covered. They are expected to be in place until the completion of the project and may occasionally be revisited by crews for testing and inspection.
- Monitoring device installation work will shift around the intersection, with crews working in the identified yellow work zones intermittently.
- Installations and lane occupancies are not expected to occur simultaneously. Crews are expected to work on individual locations before re-opening and moving to the next location.
- Temporary lane and sidewalk closures are required for crews to safely carry out this work.



What to expect

- The work is scheduled to begin as early as **April 1, 2025**, and is expected to take up to **3 weeks**.
- Work will take place on weekdays, **overnight between 9:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m.**
- Work may be postponed, extended or rescheduled due to unforeseen circumstances.
- Area residents and businesses can expect to hear noise from work equipment, specifically hydrovac trucks or drills as required to assess underground utilities and ground conditions. Crews will take measures to minimize noise impacts wherever possible.
- All closures for work are temporary and intermittent; areas will only be closed while crews are surveying the specific areas. The areas will be returned to public use upon completion of the monitoring device installation.

Queen Street East intermittent partial closures (as noted in the map):

- Work will be taking place within the site, there are no pedestrian or vehicular impacts.

Yonge Street intermittent partial closures (as noted in the map):

- The northbound and southbound lanes will be closed intermittently while work is ongoing and then reopen once work is complete
- Pedestrian passage will be maintained with the use of barriers to separate pedestrians from active work zones where sidewalk closure is required.
- Crosswalk closures may occur, pedestrians are advised to follow directional signage.
- Bike lanes will be maintained and/or rerouted with use of barriers to separate cyclists from active work zones where bike lane closures are required.
- Signage will be posted advising of restrictions.

Note: Traffic access may resume prior to 5:00 a.m. if work is completed ahead of schedule.

- Transit services will be maintained.
- After each work shift, each area will be securely covered and marked for safety until workers return or the work is complete.
- Residents and businesses near the work zones will hear noise from heavy equipment including a hydrovac truck, drill rig, and saw cutter.
- All the necessary construction permits have been obtained.
- Work may be postponed or rescheduled due to unforeseen circumstances.
- Crews will return to the work zones in the future to perform maintenance on installed devices.
