

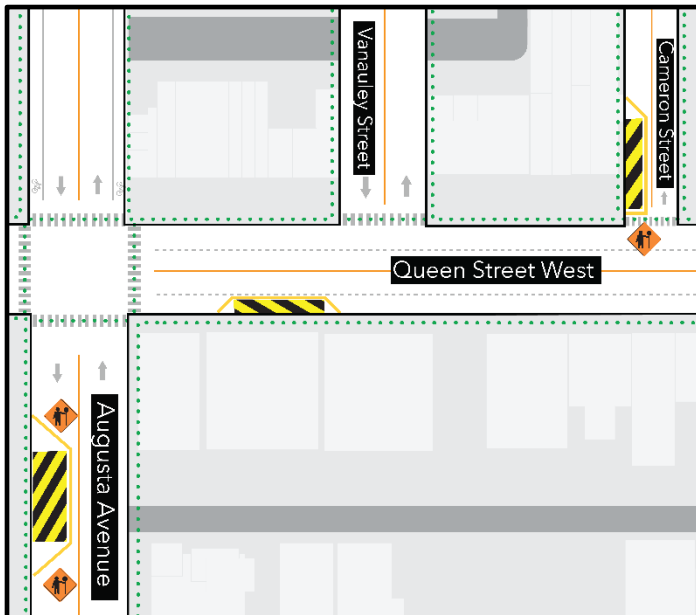
# Installation of monitoring devices: Queen Street West, Adelaide Street West and Richmond Street West

**Expected start date:** As early as April 14, 2025

**Expected duration:** Up to 2 months

**Hours of work:** Weekdays (Monday-Friday), 9:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M.

**Monitoring device installations will move around the identified intersections, with crews working in the yellow work zones intermittently.**

**Installations and lane closures are not expected to occur at the same time. Crews will focus on one location at a time, reopening it before moving on to the next.**

## What is happening?

- Crews are installing monitors and investigating utilities around **Queen St W, Adelaide St W, and Richmond St W** as indicated in the areas shown in yellow on the maps above, to support Ontario Line construction work.
- Devices are installed to monitor the area around utilities during construction. They will be installed underground and covered. They are expected to be in place until the completion of the project and may occasionally be revisited by crews for testing and inspection.
- Temporary lane and sidewalk closures are required for crews to safely carry out this work. Crews are expected to work intermittently, moving between each work zone in the intersection to complete different segments of work independently.

## What to expect

- The work is scheduled to begin as early as **April 14, 2025**, and is expected to take up to **2 months**. Work may be postponed, extended or rescheduled due to unforeseen circumstances.
- Area residents and businesses can expect to hear noise from work equipment, specifically hydrovac trucks or drills as required to assess underground utilities and ground conditions. Crews will take measures to minimize noise impacts wherever possible.
- All closures for work are temporary and intermittent; areas will only be closed while crews are surveying the specific areas. The areas will be returned to public use upon completion of the monitoring device installation.

## Intermittent partial closures (as noted in the map):

The following lanes will be closed intermittently while work is ongoing and then reopened once work is complete.

- The eastbound curb lane on Queen Street West
- The southbound curb lane on Augusta Avenue, traffic to be maintained with use of flaggers
- The southbound curb lane on Cameron Street
- Portion of Adelaide Place laneway, traffic access to be maintained with use of flaggers
- The eastbound curb lane on Adelaide Street West
- The southbound lane on Portland Street, traffic to be maintained with use of flaggers
- The westbound curb lane on Richmond Street West
- Pedestrian access will be maintained in all directions.
- Crosswalk closures may occur, pedestrians are advised to follow directional signage and flag personnel.
- Bike lanes will be maintained and/or rerouted with use of barriers to separate cyclists from active work zones where bike lane closures are required.
- Signage will be posted advising of restrictions.

**Note:** Traffic access may resume prior to 4:00 P.M. if work is completed ahead of schedule.

- Transit services will be maintained.
- After each work shift, each area will be securely covered and marked for safety until workers return or the work is complete.
- Residents and businesses near the work zones will hear noise from heavy equipment including a hydrovac truck, drill rig, and saw cutter.
- All the necessary construction permits have been obtained.
- Work may be postponed or rescheduled due to unforeseen circumstances.
- Crews will return to the work zones in the future to perform maintenance on installed devices.
