

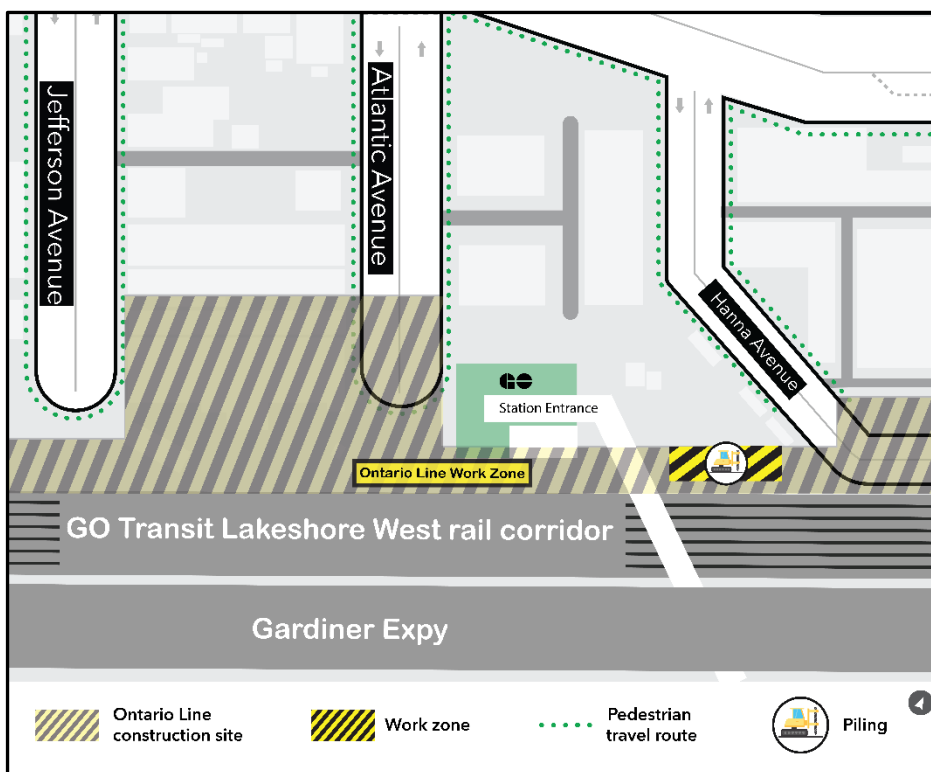
Additional evening work shift at Exhibition Station

Expected start date: As early as April 8, 2025

Expected duration: Until April 18, 2025

Hours of work: Monday to Friday (Weekdays), between 3:00 P.M. to 11:00 P.M.

What is happening?

Starting as early as **Tuesday April 8, 2025**, an additional work shift will be added to the Ontario Line work zone at Exhibition Station.

This shift will allow for the construction of the future tower crane installation, highlighted on the map, within the construction zone between Atlantic Avenue and Hanna Avenue at the southern end of Liberty Village.

What to expect

- Noise from piling work, occurring from 3:00 P.M. to 11:00

P.M. on weekdays.

- Crews will be piling to install foundational support for a new tower crane supporting the delivery of a traction power substation (TPSS) being built for the Ontario Line.
- The process consists of drilling a series of holes and filling them with concrete to create overlapping (secant) piles that form a continuous structural wall. Some of the piles are further reinforced with steel beams.
- Construction equipment will continue to move inside the designated work zone (*identified in yellow, in the above map*).
- Work equipment will access the construction area using Hanna Avenue and exit via Jefferson Avenue.

- Residents and businesses may see and hear noise from work equipment. Crews will take measures to minimize noise impacts wherever possible.
- Noise from equipment drilling piles, removing spoils and concrete work is expected.
- At Exhibition Station, residents will see drill rig machines, a crawler cranes, excavators, concrete pumps, and concrete trucks on-site during this phase of work.
- Traffic control persons will be in place as needed to ensure safety for the community and workers on-site and will remain in place for the duration of the work period.
- Work may be postponed or rescheduled due to unforeseen circumstances.
