

UPDATE: Traffic post relocation at Queen Street East and Victoria Street

Expected start date: Week of April 8, 2025

Duration: up to 2 weeks

Hours of work: Daytime between 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m.

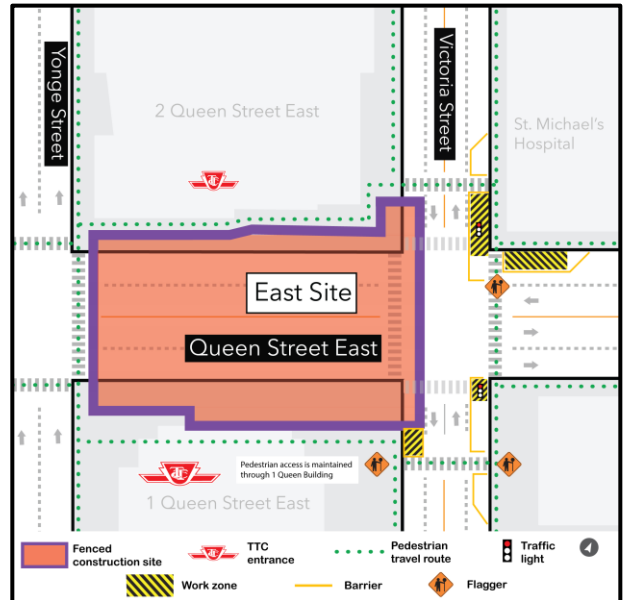
What is happening?

Construction is under way for the Ontario Line station at Queen. To allow for the continuation of the construction of the future station site, utilities work must be performed near the site.

Crews will be removing and replacing traffic posts at the intersection of Queen Street East and Victoria Street, as shown on the map.

Pedestrian passage will be accessible as shown in the map. The northbound curb lane on Victoria Street and the westbound curb lane on Queen Street East and Victoria Street will be closed while work is ongoing.

Traffic diversions around the work zone are expected to be implemented from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.



What to expect

- As early as the week of April 8, work will begin to implement traffic post relocation at the intersection of Victoria Street and Queen Street East. Work is expected to be completed over approximately two weeks.
- Most of the work will take place within the construction site boundaries. Some impact to traffic and the traffic lights is expected during relocation works outside of the East construction site.
- Noise from hydrovac trucks is expected during work hours; this type of machinery is required during utilities work to maintain safety.
- Lane and sidewalk closures may be in place intermittently during this timeframe.
- Traffic signage will be in place along the work zone to direct pedestrians in the area.
- Flag persons will be on site to ensure the safety of vehicles and pedestrians.
- All necessary construction permits will be in place prior to the commencement of the work.

Note:

- Work may be delayed, rescheduled, or extended due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.
