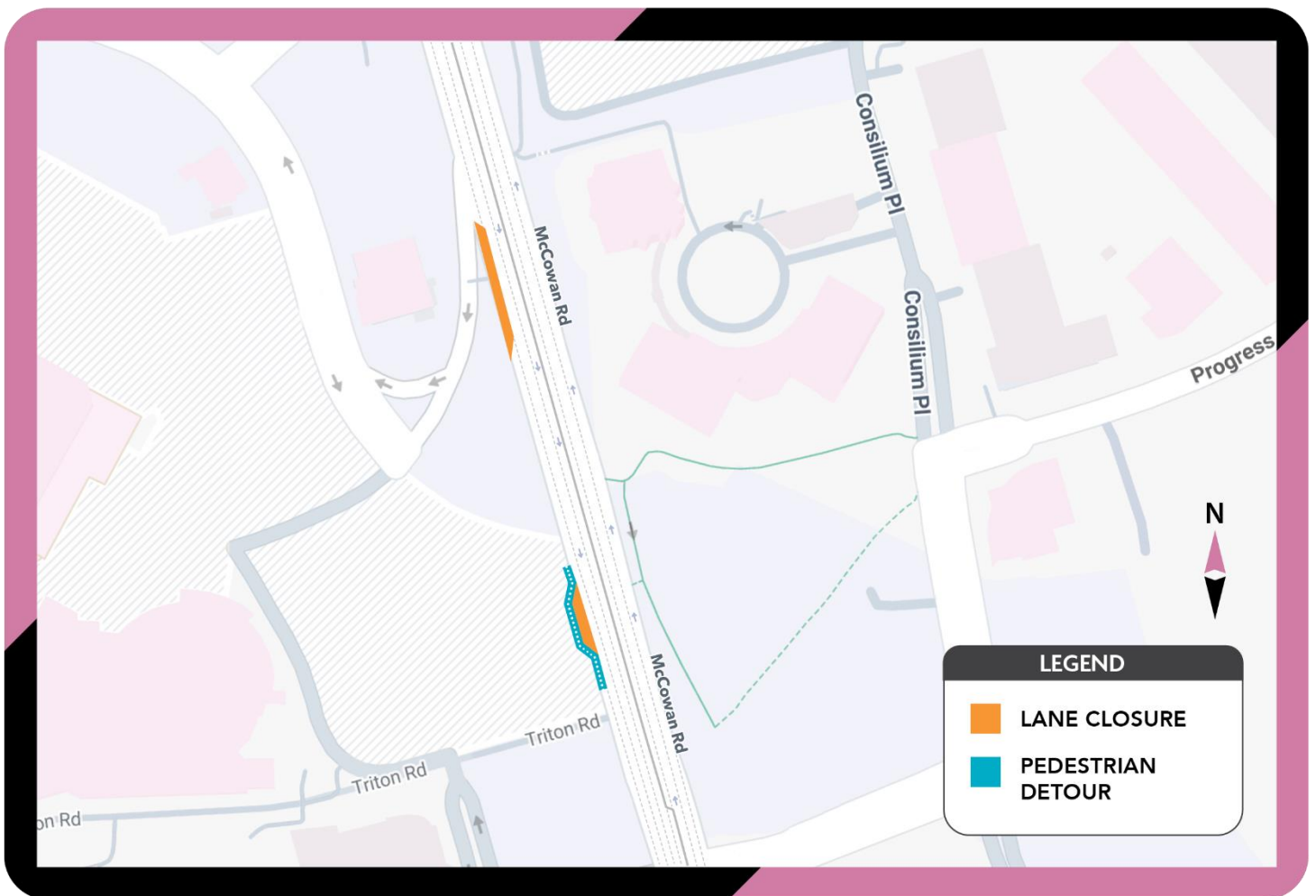


Lane closures for utility relocation work near McCowan Road and Triton Road

Schedule: April 14 to end of May, 2025

Timing: 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., weekdays

Note: All schedules are approximate and subject to change



What is Happening

- As part of Scarborough Subway Extension construction, crews need to relocate telecommunication and hydro lines on the west side of McCowan Road, north of Triton Road, which will require lane closures.
- Near the corner of Triton Road and McCowan Road, crews will be using excavators, concrete saw cutters, and a hydro vac truck to remove the asphalt and gravel and dig a trench to perform these relocations.
- Work may be delayed due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.

What to Expect

- From mid-April to the end of May, the more northerly work site location, as indicated on the map above, will periodically require the southbound, curb side traffic lane on McCowan Road to be reduced during work hours of 7:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. Each evening after 5:00 p.m., the work area will be dismantled, and the southbound traffic lane will reopen.
- From early to late May, the McCowan Road southbound curb lane will remain closed beyond work hours, day and night, due to required excavation and trenching for cable relocation. Right-hand turns will still be possible, and the bus stop at this location will remain in use.
- From early to late May, the pedestrian pathway on the northwest corner of McCowan Road and Triton Road will be diverted. This diversion will be delineated by fencing and wayfinding signage.
- There will be no hydro or telecommunication interruptions to residents or businesses due to this work.
- Work areas will be clearly marked or fenced off to ensure public and worker safety.
- Nearby residents may hear noise from this construction activity. Crews will be monitoring the activity and will take steps to mitigate noise where possible.

About the Project

- A nearly eight-kilometre subway extension will extend Line 2 further into Scarborough.
- Three new stops will have connections to up to six other transit options, including TTC buses, GO train, GO buses, the Line 5 Eglinton, Durham Region Transit, and the proposed Sheppard Extension.
- The extension will accommodate up to 105,000 daily boardings and put 34,000 more jobs within walking distance to rapid transit.
