

UPDATED: New Hours of Work at King-Bathurst South Site

Expected start date: As of May 2, 2025
Duration: Through late 2025
Hours of work: Monday through Friday, from 7:00 a.m. through 11:00 p.m., and Saturdays from 8:00 a.m. through 5:00 p.m. Some work will occur on Sundays as needed, from 8:00 to 5:00 p.m.

What is station excavation?

- Work crews are advancing excavation at the King-Bathurst south site, removing soil and bedrock to a depth of 40 metres to create the future Ontario Line station site. As spoils are removed, a shaft (the excavated open area) has been created.
- This work is completed in sequence, with coordinated phases of rock breaking followed by installation of structural reinforcements.
- Crews are preparing to start the next phase of excavation including rock breaking beginning as early as May 2, 2025. This phase of work is expected to take approximately eight weeks to complete. At which point, the next phases of structural support will be installed.
- The excavation cycle (rock breaking and structural reinforcement) will repeat through to the completion of excavation of the site shaft, which is expected by the end of 2025.

- New work hours are in place to enable this phase of construction, with crews working from 7:00a.m. to 11:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, and Saturdays from 8:00 a.m. through 5:00 p.m. Some work will occur on Sundays as needed, from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.
- Residents will see and hear the tower crane in use at the King-Bathurst south site, a mobile crane, excavators, as well as welding occurring, and equipment deliveries. Equipment will be moved into the shaft as needed.

What to expect

- There will be lighting in place to support evening work. While most lights will turn off once work is complete, some lighting will remain on overnight for safety and security at the site.
- To reduce impacts to residents and businesses in the area, mitigations are in place including air quality, noise and vibration monitoring, site hoarding, additional paved areas, sprinkler systems and mud mats for dust suppression.
