

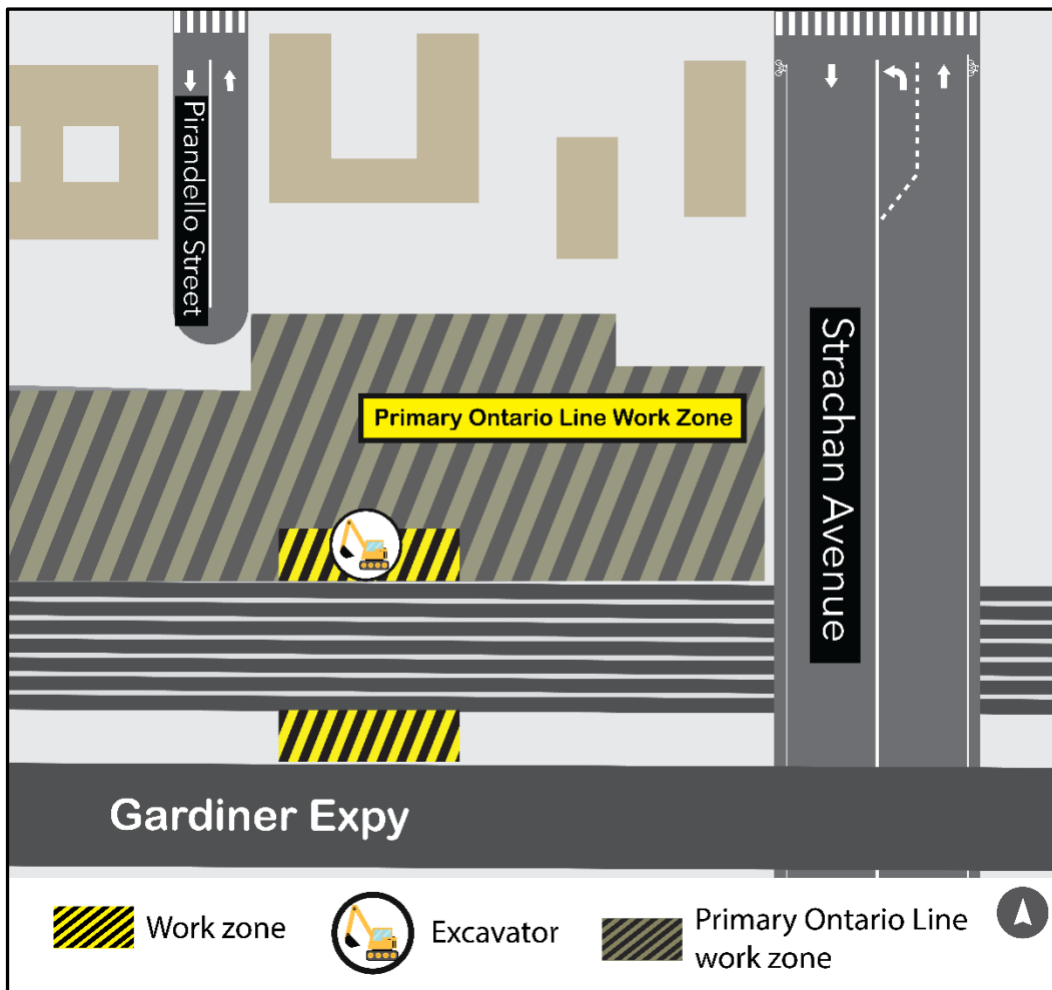
# Ontario Line utilities conduit boring

**Expected Start Date:** As early as May 2, 2025

**Expected Duration:** Through July 15, 2025

**Hours of Work:** 6 days a week, Monday through Saturday, from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., and from 7:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m.

## What is happening?

To accommodate the future Ontario Line subway and expanded Exhibition Station, crews will work to expand and connect power requirements by constructing a conduit tunnel beneath the existing GO Lakeshore West rail corridor.

This utilities conduit tunnel will support the traction power substation (TPSS), which helps power future Ontario Line trains.

This phase of work will take place at the east end of the Ontario Line Exhibition site entrance, on both sides of the rail corridor, towards Strachan Avenue.

## What to expect

- During this phase of construction crews will use trucks and trailers to deliver equipment, excavators, demolition equipment and a jack and bore machine to connect a small tunnel from south to north, under the rail corridor.
- Demolition of abandoned support structures (retaining wall) adjacent to the rail tracks.
- Trucks entering the north site will travel through Hanna Avenue, towards the work site through the Ontario Line work zone, and exit westward via Jefferson Avenue to Liberty Street, and Dufferin Street.
- Trucks entering the south site will access the work area via Manitoba Drive westbound, and then into the work site, noted on the above map.
- Traffic flag persons will be in place to ensure safety, and that vehicles, pedestrian and customer access will be maintained through Liberty Village and Exhibition Place.
- Work will occur , from Monday through Saturday in two shifts, from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., and then overnight, from 7:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m.
- There will be no impact to GO Train operations or service.
- Residents and businesses can expect to hear noise from excavation and boring equipment working between the Gardiner Expressway, the rail corridor and the Ontario Line work zone, west of Strachan Avenue, south of Liberty Village.
- Work may be postponed or re-scheduled due to unforeseen circumstances.
- All necessary construction permits have been obtained.
