
Tree removals at Bain Avenue and Pape Avenue

Expected start date: As early as May 27, 2025Expected duration: One to two daysHours of work: Weekdays, 8 a.m. to 3 p.m.



What is happening?

- The northeast corner of Pape Ave. and Bain Ave. is the future site of an emergency exit building (EEB) for the Ontario Line. These buildings are spaced between stations to provide exits for riders and access for first responders in the event of an emergency.
- To accommodate the future construction activities for the Pape segment of the Ontario Line, crews will remove select trees and clear vegetation at the Bain Avenue EEB site.
- Pre-construction surveys during bird nesting season will be conducted to identify active nests or habitats of species at risk in accordance with the Species at Risk Act.
- Our vegetation guideline requires planting 1 to 50 trees for every one removed, depending on the tree's size and location. Typically, three trees are planted for every one that is removed. This ensures more trees are planted than removed as we carry out the largest transit expansion in the history of the region.

What to expect

- Two trees will be removed from the future Bain EEB site.
- Tree removal work will take approximately one to two days.
- A section of sidewalk on the north side of Bain Ave. to be closed during working hours. The closure will be day-to-day: the sidewalk will be closed at the beginning of the workday, cleaned, and reopened at the end of the shift.
- Parking on the south side of Bain Ave. across from the work area will be restricted during working hours.
- Work will take place during weekdays from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m.
- Noise from construction equipment including excavators, trucks, chainsaws and woodchippers can be expected.
- Construction equipment and materials will be properly secured within the work zone.
- This work may be delayed due to inclement weather and/or unforeseen circumstances.

About the project

- 15.6-kilometre subway line that will make it faster and easier to travel within Toronto and beyond.
- 15 stops and more than 40 connections to other transit, including GO train, subway, LRT, streetcar, and bus lines.
- Less than 30 minutes from one end of the line to the other.
- 28,000 fewer cars on the road each day.
