Night Work between Norwood Road and Main Street

May 20, 2025 - Mid July 2025



What is happening?

Beginning on the week of May 20th, crews will be conducting site surveying activities at night in the Lakeshore East Rail Corridor between Norwood Road and Main Street. Surveying activities are expected to last approximately one to two weeks and generate very little noise. After surveying, crews will conduct excavation works, granular placement, soakaway installation, and subdrain installations for approximately 4-6 weeks. These activities are essential for the safe operation of the trains and installation of future tracks. This work will be conducted within the rail corridor. **For safety reasons, this work must be conducted at night when the trains are not running.** All timelines are subject to change based on weather conditions and unforeseen elements. We apologize for the inconvenience and ask for your patience as we complete this critical work.

Construction activity	Timescale	Working hours	Description of work
Site Surveying	May 20 th - June 1 st (approximate)	12 AM to 5 AM	Crews will be assessing site conditions. This will be done with surveying tools and handheld tools which will generate minimal noise.
Excavation, granular placement, soakaway installation and subdrain installation	Early June – Mid July	12 AM to 5 AM	Crews will be utilizing construction equipment such as backhoes, miniexcavators and vacuum trucks to conduct excavations, place granular, and install water drainage infrastructure. This is expected to cause noise and vibrations for residents in the area.

HOURS OF WORK

 We will be working between 12 am to 5 am during the construction period and mobilization will begin around 11:30 pm.

WHAT TO EXPECT

- Residents should expect some noise, vibration and potentially site lighting. Some dust may be generated from the construction activities.
- Our staff will take reasonable precautions to minimize disturbances to residents and commuters, including but not limited to the following:
 - Reduced idling of non-essential equipment
 - Pointing lights away from residential windows (if used)
 - The work area will be safely secured.

TRAFFIC & PEDESTRIAN DETAILS

 Increased construction and delivery vehicles and equipment can be expected in the vicinity of the work area.
