
Storm Lateral Connections at TPSS 2: Sidewalk Closure at South Service Road east of Hurontario Street Saturday, June 14, 2025 from 7AM-7PM



What work is taking place?

To power the light rail vehicles on the Hazel McCallion Line, crews must connect traction powered substation (TPSS) units to the City of Mississauga's electrical grid. To complete this, crews must first install the remaining storm pipes at the TPSS unit. During this process, a crane will be in place to hold the existing utility pole in place that is near the storm pipes to safely carry out these works. As a result, a portion of the south sidewalk along South Service Road, just east of Hurontario Street, will be closed to pedestrians until this work is complete. This work is scheduled to take place between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. on Saturday June 14, 2025 when school is not in session.

Traffic signal timings may be adjusted to keep traffic moving and pedestrian crossings will be maintained at signalized crosswalks. Please follow the signs installed onsite to assist with navigating around the closure.



This notice is meant to advise that residents near the work site can expect to hear noise and vibration caused by trucks, excavators, loaders, tri-axles, backhoes, and other construction equipment related to this work.

TIMING

- Work is scheduled from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. on Saturday June 14.
- Work could be rescheduled and/or delayed due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.

- Watch for additional signs directing passengers at bus stops as boarding areas may be relocated.

WHAT TO EXPECT

- Every effort will be made to minimize disruptions.
- Access to properties will be maintained.
- Businesses near work site can expect to hear noise caused by trucks, excavators, backhoes, and other construction equipment related to this work.

TRAFFIC AND PEDESTRIAN DETAILS

- Eastbound and westbound movements will be permitted along South Service Road, east of Hurontario Street.
- Emergency vehicle access will be maintained.
- Traffic delays are expected.
- A portion of the south sidewalk at South Service Road, east of Hurontario Street will be closed to pedestrians for the safety of crews and the surrounding community while these works are taking place.
- Watch for slow moving vehicles entering and exiting work areas.
- Remember to reduce your speed when approaching lane reductions.
