

Transition to permanent station construction at Moss Park

Expected start date: As early as June 9, 2025

Hours of work: Weekdays (Monday to Friday) from 6:30 a.m. to 11:00 p.m., and weekends (Saturday) as required from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

What's happening:

Crews are nearing the end of the excavation phase as they complete shaping the underground space for the future Ontario Line station and tunnels.

In the coming days, work will transition to the start of permanent station construction, including the installation of structural elements that will form the station's foundation.

What to expect:

- Installing a waterproofing system: Permanent waterproofing membranes will be applied to the station's underground walls to keep water from seeping into the station preventing leaks and water damage.
- Pouring the base slab: Crews will begin constructing the base slab – the first major structural element that will form the foundation of the station box.
- Paving the street-level work platform: At the surface, crews will grade and pave the working platform to create a cleaner and more stable surface. This will improve dust control and help manage work more efficiently in different weather conditions.
- Expected on-site construction equipment includes various concrete sprayers, telehandlers, boom lifts, concrete mixers and pumps, troweling machines, grading equipment, asphalt pavers, and other machinery as required during this work.

- Additional work hours may be required to allow teams to complete consecutive works. Advance notice will be provided.
- Working hours are not expected to extend beyond 11:00 p.m.
- Crews will arrive to site prior to the start of works to set up equipment.
- Truck traffic will enter and leave worksites daily at the Sherbourne Street and Queen Street East access gates, following specified routes.
- To reduce impacts to residents and businesses in the area, mitigations are in place including air quality, noise and vibration monitoring, street cleaning, site hoarding, additional paved areas, sprinkler systems and mud mats for dust suppression.
