


Scarborough Subway Extension

The Scarborough Subway Extension will bring the TTC's Line 2 subway nearly eight kilometres farther into Scarborough. It will extend from Kennedy Station to Sheppard Avenue and McCowan Road, providing quick and seamless transit for those heading into and out of the downtown core and those travelling within Scarborough.





There will be 3 new stations along the alignment:

- **Sheppard and McCowan**
 - **Scarborough Centre**
 - **Lawrence and McCowan**
- Approximate length: 7.8 km
 - Anticipated boardings: 105,000 daily boardings
 - Access to transit: 38,000 more people within walking distance to transit
 - Access to jobs: More than 34,000 jobs within a 10-minute walk from a new station

Sheppard and McCowan station

Sheppard Avenue and McCowan Road

- Will bring direct access to rapid transit to customers who live and work north of Highway 401.
- Will feature a bus terminal with passenger pick-up and drop-off facilities.
- Customers in the northern part of Scarborough will spend less time on buses to travel downtown, with a transfer at this station instead of Scarborough Centre.




- Transfers between regional and local transit and the subway line will be convenient and reliable.
- Will feature a new bus terminal with passenger pick-up and drop-off facilities.

What is a Feature Wall?




Feature walls are prominent surfaces within the station environment made up of a colour and pattern unique to each station. They help riders orient themselves along the line and identify their station easily.

TTC Line 2: Existing Feature Walls



Feature walls with colours and patterns are used at existing Line 2 TTC stations to help riders easily recognize their station from the train.

Feature Wall Systems and Materials



The new stations along the Scarborough Subway Extension will have feature walls along the platforms, each with a unique visual identity using colours, motifs and patterns. The feature walls are being designed to allow for a range of colours and patterns that complement surrounding materials, while also considering modularity, durability and maintenance.

Two tiling patterns were developed inspired by local geography and geologies


Pattern 1:

Inspired by local topography - aerial view of land surface.




They run across the length of the platform and help draw riders towards stairs and escalators.
