Updated summer hours: Construction at Kennedy Station



What is Happening

- As part of ongoing efforts to extend Line 2 subway service from Kennedy Station for the Scarborough Subway Extension, construction activities at this site will be continuing throughout 2025. Activities will include:
 - o Continued construction of the West Ventilation Fan Plant (WVFP) Building
 - The WVFP building is critical to ensuring air quality remains high and additional ventilation needs are met in the nearly eight-kilometre extension of Line 2. It also provides additional ventilation in the event of a fire.
 - o <u>Construction of the Tunnel Ventilation System Electric Building (TVSEB)</u>
 - The TVSEB will house systems needed to provide power to ventilation infrastructure.

What to Expect

- For the safety of the crews during the summer months, construction activity will be adjusted based on the hot temperatures in the afternoons.
- Crews will be excavating and pouring concrete for below grade foundational structures.
- Existing utilities in surrounding areas will be relocated in support of the future subway infrastructure. This work will be completed in a manner that endeavours to minimize negative community impact and could include night work to avoid traffic congestion.
- Residents and businesses near the Kennedy Station work site can expect to hear noise caused by trucks, excavators, concrete cutters, and other construction equipment and activities.
- Work areas will be clearly marked or fenced off as required to ensure public safety.
- Work may be delayed due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.

About the Project

- A nearly eight-kilometre subway extension will extend Line 2 further into Scarborough.
- Three new stops will have connections to up to six other transit options, including TTC buses, GO trains, GO buses, Line 5 Eglinton, Durham Region Transit, and the proposed Sheppard Extension.
- The extension will accommodate up to 105,000 daily boardings and put 34,000 more jobs within walking distance to rapid transit.
