Temporary Turning Restrictions at Dundas Street and Hurontario Street for TPSS Construction and Telecom Installations July-August, 2025



What You Need to Know

Crews will be constructing the Traction Power Substation at the northeast section and telecom infrastructure at the southeast section of Hurontario Street and Dundas Street in July and August 2025. This will result in temporary lane restrictions and turning restrictions at the intersection. Please look for detour signage for detours.

The driveway next to 14 Dundas Street East will also be closed during this duration. This impact can begin as early as July 8, 2025. Access to all the properties will be maintained.

The construction and energization of TPSS will continue until early **September 2025**. The delivery of the TPSS box is expected in mid-July. The delivery will occur during night and may generate some noise.

TIMING

- Telecommunications infrastructure is scheduled to begin at Dundas Street and Hurontario Street in early July and will last until early August, 2025.
- TPSS construction and energization will continue until September 2025.
- Work could be rescheduled and delayed due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.

TRAFFIC DETAILS

- Left turns for motorists onto Hurontario Steet from Dundas Street will not be permitted.
- Right turns for motorists from Hurontario onto Dundas Street will not be permitted on a red traffic signal.
- Traffic delays are expected.
- Watch for slow moving vehicles entering and exiting work areas.
- Remember to reduce your speed when approaching lane reductions.

WHAT TO EXPECT?

- Every effort will be made to minimize disruptions.
- Residents and businesses near the work site can expect to hear noise and vibration caused by trucks, excavators, loaders, tri-axles, backhoes, and other construction equipment related to this work.

TRANSIT DETAILS

PEDESTRIAN DETAILS

- Please take care when travelling near construction areas.
- Sidewalk access may be closed for short durations.
