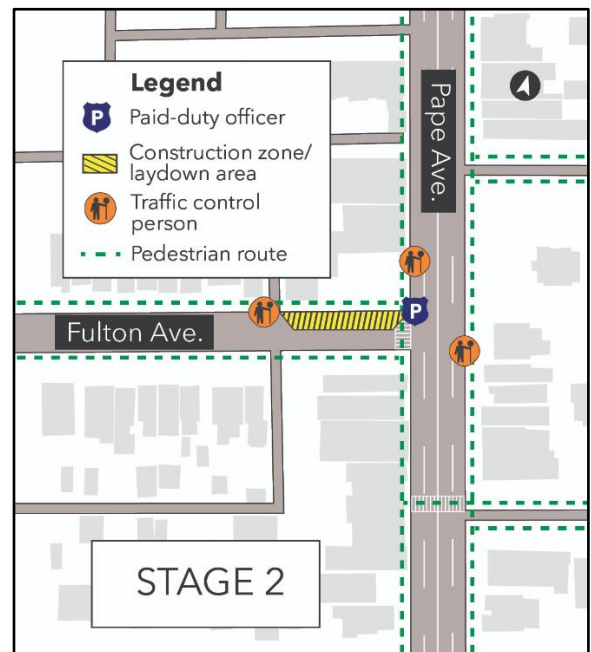
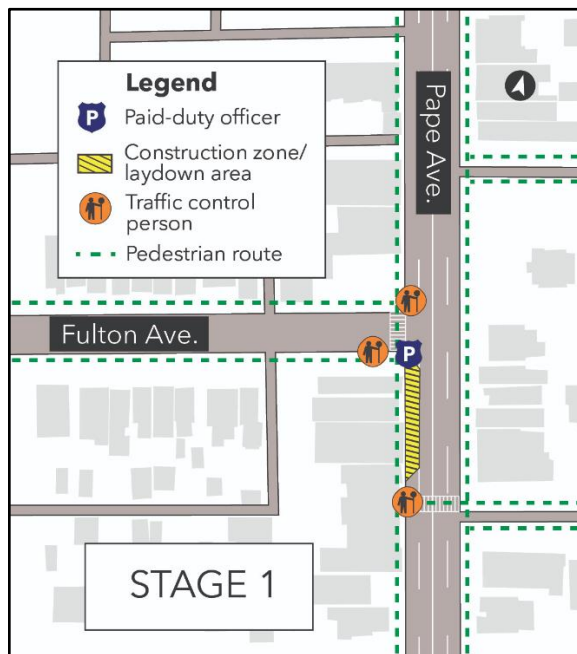


Update: Geotechnical work on Pape Avenue and Fulton Avenue

Expected start date: As early as July 28, 2025

Expected duration: One night

Hours of work: Overnight, 9 p.m. – 5 a.m.



What is happening?

- To enable future construction activities for the Ontario Line project, crews will be conducting geotechnical investigations at the intersection of Pape Avenue and Fulton Avenue.
- Geotechnical investigations consist of drilling boreholes. These investigations are essential to understand soil and rock properties, minimize construction risk and protect nearby buildings and infrastructure.

What to expect

- Work will take place overnight, from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m.
- Drilling and excavation equipment, such as drill rigs and water hauling, hydrovac, concrete and coring trucks will be on site. During the vertical drilling phase, noise, dust and vibration from construction equipment is expected.

- The work will occur in two stages:
 - **Stage 1:** Beginning at 9 p.m. on the night of July 28, 2025, the southbound curbside lane of Pape Avenue at the intersection of Pape Avenue and Fulton Avenue will be closed.
 - **Stage 2:** Beginning around 1:00 a.m. July 29, 2025, the southbound curbside lane of Pape Avenue will re-open. Fulton Avenue will be reduced to one lane in the vicinity of the work zone, but bi-directional traffic will be maintained by traffic control personnel.
- Access to the south side of Fulton Avenue, as well as residential and commercial driveways will be maintained.
- Signage and safety barriers will be in place to delineate work zones.
- Paid-duty officers and traffic control personnel will be on-site managing traffic and pedestrian flow. The site will be supervised throughout the work.
- Mobile lights may be used to illuminate the site and ensure safe working conditions.
- TTC bus service will be maintained throughout the work.
- Timing of construction is subject to weather conditions and construction constraints.
- Dust will be mitigated by misting and sweeping.
