
Traffic Deck Installation on Gertrude Pl.

Expected start date: As early as late August **Expected duration:** Approximately one (1) month **Hours of work:** Monday to Saturday, 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.



What is happening?

- As early as late August, crews will begin installing a traffic deck within the Pape-Danforth construction site along Gertrude Place between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m., Monday through Saturday.
- Traffic decking is a timber support structure on top of steel frames over which vehicles can travel. It allows crews to work underground while traffic flows uninterrupted overtop.
- The traffic deck will create new space for traffic on Gertrude Place so future jet grouting works on can be completed while east-west traffic continues to flow on Gertrude Place.
- The traffic shift onto the deck will occur in October, coinciding with the start of the next stage of jet grouting works on Gertrude Place. A separate notification will be distributed at that time outlining the work and the new traffic plan.

What to expect

- The south sidewalk will remain closed. Pedestrians will continue to cross Gertrude Place using the crosswalk at Muriel.
- Clear and defined walking paths will be maintained to ensure public safety.
- There will be no additional impacts to street parking as a result of traffic decking installation.
- All works will be done inside of the existing site, so additional traffic disruptions are not expected.
- Construction equipment and materials will be secured within the work zones.
- Signage and safety barriers will be in place to delineate work zones.
- There will be no impacts to TTC bus or subway service from this work.
- Work may be delayed due to inclement weather and/or unforeseen circumstances.
