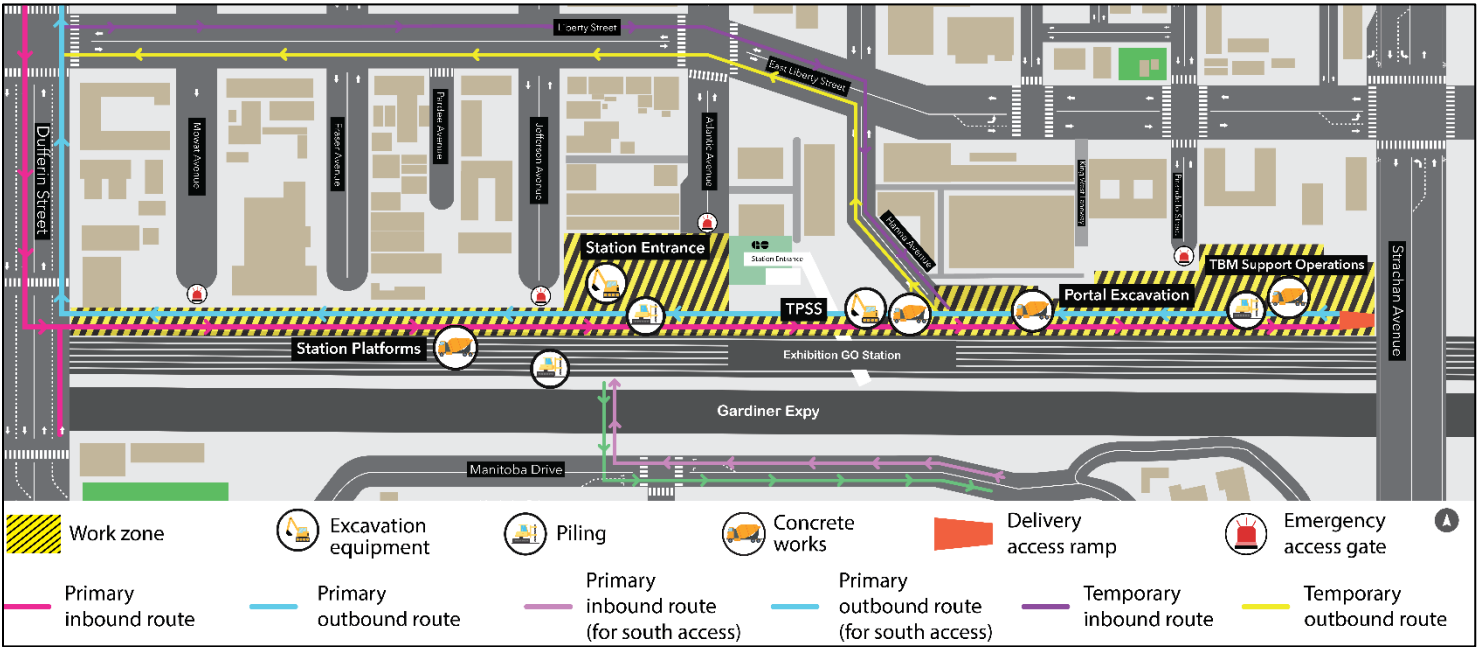


Exhibition construction update

August 2025



What is happening?

Construction remains ongoing to deliver the Ontario Line at Exhibition. Through fall and winter 2025, crews will continue to construct various projects at the site, including station platforms, foundations for a new station entrance, the Ontario Line portal and a traction power substation to the area.

This phase of ongoing work includes the following:

Exhibition Station Platforms

Expected start date for next phase of work: end of August 2025

UPDATED Hours of work: Monday through Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m., and occasional Saturdays from 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Occasional overnight work from 11:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m.

- Permanent works at the station platforms is required for structural foundations for future steel structures on site.
- Foundation and structural support, concrete works, waterproofing, rebar and caissons installation are required for this phase of work.
- Occasional overnight work, including material and concrete deliveries as well as concrete work is required to accommodate rail restrictions.
- Pedestrian and customer access will be maintained through Exhibition Station to Liberty Village through and Exhibition Place, using the accessible tunnel or pedestrian bridge.

New Exhibition Station Entrance Building

Expected start date for next phase of work: mid-August 2025

Hours of work: Monday to Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m., and occasional Saturdays from 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

- Excavation is now complete at the future station entrance. Permanent works at the station entrance is required for structural foundations for future structures.
- Foundation and structural support, concrete works, waterproofing and rebar installations are required for this phase of work.

Ontario Line Launch Portal

Expected start date: Work already in progress

Hours of work: Monday through Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m., with occasional 5:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m. shifts and occasional Saturdays from 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

- A tunnel launch portal continues to be constructed at the east end of the Ontario Line work site.
- Excavation at the portal is now complete. Permanent works at the portal are required for

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structural foundations for future structures.

- Foundation and structural support, concrete works, waterproofing and rebar installations are required for this phase of work.
- To complete the concrete foundation, crews, concrete trucks and pumps are required to be on site as early as 5:00 a.m., this is required up to once a week until the end of October 2025. (Separate notice to be sent prior to concrete pours)

Traction Power Substation (TPSS)

Expected start date for next phase of work: mid-September 2025

Hours of work: Monday to Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m., and occasional Saturdays from 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

Expected duration: end of May 2026

- The TPSS will power the Ontario Line trains entering and exiting the tunnels portal.
- Permanent works for the TPSS is required for structural foundations for future structures.
- Foundation and structural support, concrete works, waterproofing and tie down installations are required for this phase of work.

To support this ongoing work across the Ontario Line site at Exhibition, occasional overnight or early morning deliveries are expected through the end of 2025. These deliveries are scheduled during off-peak hours to reduce daytime traffic disruptions and ensure timely progress on critical construction activities.

What to Expect

- Neighbours will hear and see several types of construction equipment in use during this phase, including excavators, hydrovac trucks, cranes, concrete trucks/ pumps, welding machines, front-end loaders, land grading equipment, and drill rigs, to name a few. Other equipment will be in use as required and may be added or removed from the site throughout the duration of work.
- When required, flag personnel will guide vehicles to and from sites, ensuring pedestrian, cyclist, and vehicle safety.
- Mitigations are in place to limit the impact of debris and dirt to city streets.
- Crews may arrive on site earlier than 7:00 a.m. to prepare machinery and equipment.
- On hot days, crews may begin less impactful works as early as 5:00 a.m., and end works earlier to accommodate heat and worker safety.
- Work may be postponed or rescheduled due to unforeseen circumstances.
