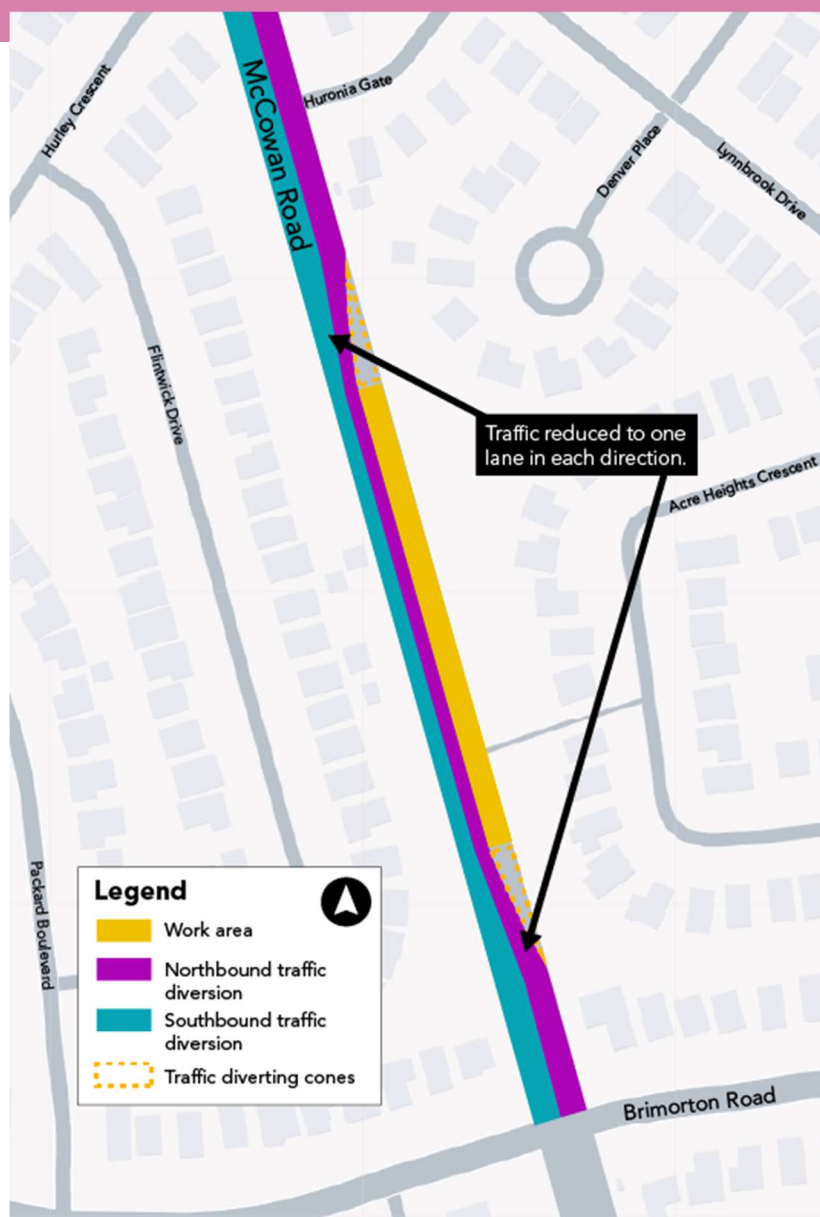


Jet grouting for tunnel construction

Start date/Duration: Late May – Late September 2025

Hours of work: Monday to Saturday from 6:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m

Note: Dates may be impacted due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.



What is happening?

- Starting in late May 2025, crews will begin jet grouting to improve soil conditions before tunnel excavation begins.
- Jet grouting involves injecting and mixing cement-based grout into the ground to create a stronger, more stable soil structure. This process will help prevent ground movement, reduce water infiltration, and support safe TBM excavation.
- The work site will be located on McCowan Road, north of Brimorton Road, as shown on the map.

Vehicle diversions

- Road widening will be required on the east side of McCowan Road. This work will take place first, in late May.
- Jet grouting construction at this site will occur in two phases. For the first phase of construction, starting in late May 2025, all traffic will be diverted to the west side of McCowan Road, with one lane of traffic in each direction, as shown on the map.
- Diversions will be indicated with signage and barriers, and flaggers will be present.

What to expect?

- Expect noise from on-site construction equipment, including jet grout pumps, cement silos, front-end loaders, trucks, and other machinery.
- Traffic barrels, fencing, and barriers will be in place to separate and secure work zones.
- To ensure pedestrian and driver safety, construction crews will occasionally temporarily close traffic lanes and sidewalks along McCowan Road. Signage will alert drivers and pedestrians to these temporary closures and detours.
- Please take care when travelling near construction areas and watch for additional signs directing pedestrians. Clear and defined walking paths will be maintained to ensure pedestrian safety.

About the project

- A nearly eight-kilometre subway extension will extend Line 2 further into Scarborough.
- Three new stops will have connections to up to six other transit options, including TTC buses, GO train, GO buses, Line 5 Eglinton, Durham Region Transit, and the proposed Sheppard Extension.
- The extension will accommodate up to 105,000 daily boardings and put 34,000 more jobs within walking distance to rapid transit.
