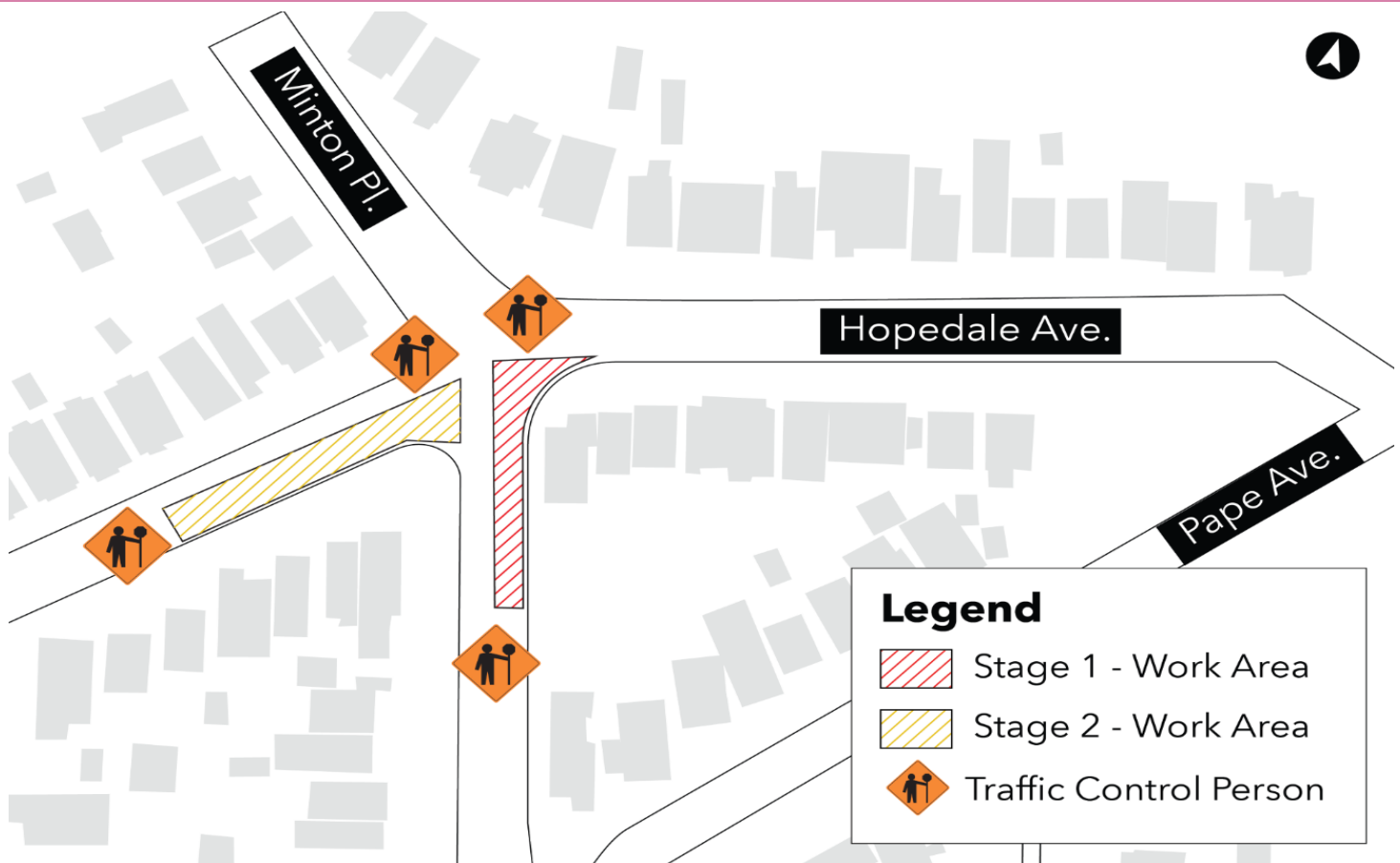


Subsurface utilities investigation on Hopedale Avenue south of Minton Place

Expected start date: As early as August 23, 2025

Expected duration: One day

Hours of work: Saturday: 9 a.m. – 4 p.m.



What is happening?

- To enable future construction activities for the Ontario Line, crews will conduct subsurface utilities investigations along Hopedale Avenue and Minton Place.
- Investigations consist of small test hole drilling on the road.
- Utilities investigations are essential to understanding the location and position of utilities that exist near the future Ontario Line tunnel alignment.

What to expect

- Hopedale Avenue will have a temporary lane closure for utility investigations during work hours in one stage of the activity.
- Minton Place will also have a temporary lane closure for utility investigations during work hours in a separate stage of the activity on the same day.
- As the utility investigations are conducted in stages, the temporary lane closures on Hopedale Avenue and Minton Place will not occur at the same time.
- Driveways from 85 to 95 Hopedale Avenue may experience temporary disruptions, but access will be maintained.
- Traffic control personnel will be in place to assist residents with driveway access.
- A hydrovac may be on site, depending on the investigation work required.
- Signage will be in place to delineate work zones.
- During some phases of work, noise and dust from construction equipment is expected.
- Safety barriers will be placed around the maintenance hole or road cut area. The site will be supervised throughout the work.
- Traffic control personnel will be on-site managing traffic flow, as required.
- Underground utilities will be marked using temporary spray paint and chalk.
- Timing of construction is subject to weather conditions and construction constraints.

About the project

- 15.6-kilometre subway line that will make it faster and easier to travel within Toronto and beyond.
- 15 stops and more than 40 connections to other transit, including GO train, subway, LRT, streetcar and bus lines.
- Less than 30 minutes from one end of the line to the other.
- 28,000 fewer cars on the road each day.
