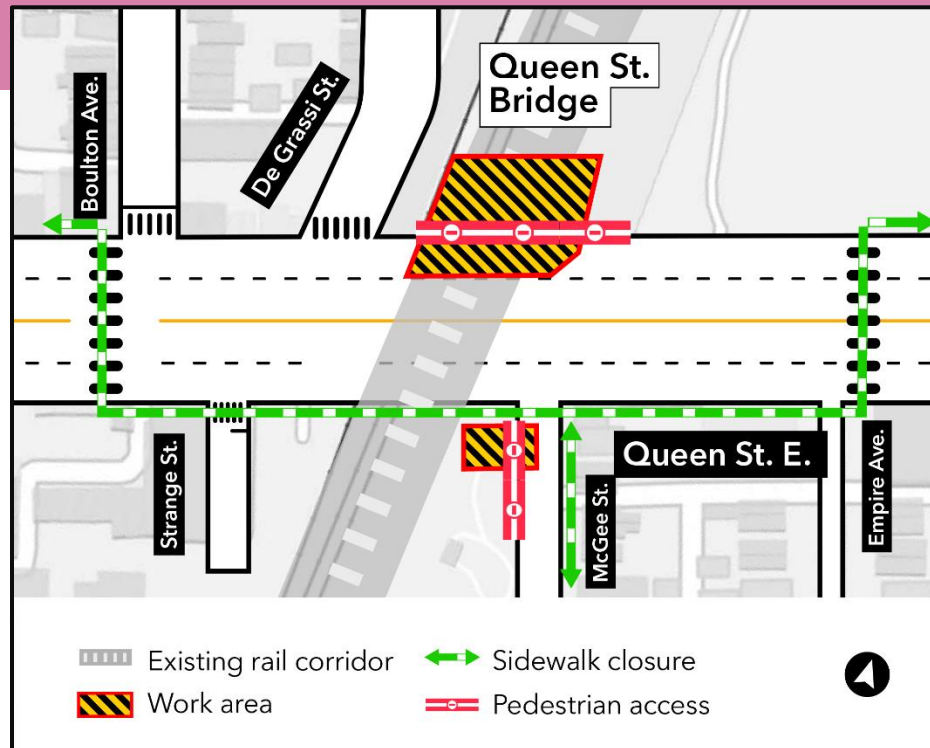


Sewer connection work at the Queen Street bridge

Start date: As early as Monday, September 8, 2025.

Duration: Two (2) weeks

Hours of work: Monday - Friday, between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m., with some weekend work on Saturdays between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m. and Sundays from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.



What is happening?

- The new rail bridges at Queen, Dundas and Logan have drainage systems to prevent flooding and water damage.
- Work needs to take place to connect the drainage system to city sewers at each bridge.
- Work at the Queen Street bridge will start as early as Monday, September 8, 2025.
- Work will take place on weekdays between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m., with some weekend work on Saturdays between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m. and Sundays from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.
- Sidewalk and lane closures will be required to safely complete this work.

Traffic and pedestrian details

- Westbound traffic on Queen Street East will be reduced to one lane under the Queen Street bridge.
- The sidewalk on the north side of Queen Street East will be closed under the bridge.
- The sidewalk on the west side of McGee Street will be closed at Queen Street East.

What to expect

- Noise from construction equipment like hydro-vacs, excavators and hand tools can be expected.
- Construction activities will include uncovering underground utilities, excavation and sewer work.
- Clear signage will be in place to direct pedestrians and vehicles.
- Traffic control personnel, such as traffic signalers, flaggers and paid duty officers, will be present to assist pedestrians and vehicles with navigating the site.
- Traffic barrels, fencing and barriers will be in place to separate and secure work zones.
- Construction equipment and materials will be properly secured within the work zones.
- Traffic markings will be removed and painted on the roadway as required to guide motorists and cyclists.
- Work may be delayed due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.

About the project

- 15.6-kilometre subway line that will make it faster and easier to travel within Toronto and beyond.
- 15 stops and more than 40 connections to other transit, including GO train, subway, LRT, streetcar and bus lines.
- Approximately 30 minutes from one end of the line to the other.
- 28,000 fewer cars on the road each day.
