
Piling and excavation at the future south entrance and platforms for Exhibition station

Expected Duration: September through end of November 2025



What is happening?

Construction continues on the Ontario Line at Exhibition. Through fall and winter 2025, work will progress on-site, with new activity starting south of the area in September for the future station's south entrance.

This phase of ongoing work includes the following:

South Entrance Excavation

Expected start date for next phase of work: as early as September 8, 2025

Expected duration: Through the end of November 2025

Hours of work: Monday to Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., and occasional Saturdays from 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

- Excavation work is starting at the south entrance of the future Exhibition station.
- Crews will begin to excavate the soil and rock. As spoils are removed, a shaft will be created which will support a future entrance to the elevated station that will cross over the tracks.
- Work hours may vary based on activities. Additional working hours or days may be required to allow teams to complete works in sequence, such as occasional Saturdays shifts.
- To reduce impacts to residents and businesses in the area, mitigations are in place including air quality, noise and vibration monitoring.

Exhibition Station Platforms Piling

Expected start date for next phase of work: as early as September 15, 2025

Expected duration: Through the end of November 2025

Hours of work: Monday through Friday from 9:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. and occasional Saturdays from 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

- Piling on the island platforms will resume in September 2025.
- This work is required for structural support of the future station staircase, which will connect the future station with the existing pedestrian tunnel. This work is required for structural

- support of the future station staircase, which will connect the future station with the existing pedestrian tunnel.
- Pedestrian and customer access to existing GO Transit services will be maintained through Exhibition station to Liberty Village and Exhibition Place, using the accessible tunnel or pedestrian bridge.

What to Expect

- Neighbours will hear and see several types of construction equipment in use during this phase, including piling machines, excavators, cranes, concrete trucks/ pumps, welding machines, frontend loaders, land grading equipment, hauling trucks and drill rigs, to name a few. Other equipment will be in use as required and may be added or removed from the site throughout the duration of the work.
- When required, flag personnel will guide vehicles to and from sites, ensuring pedestrian, cyclist, and vehicle safety.
- Mitigations are in place to limit the impact of debris and dirt to city streets.
- Crews may arrive on site earlier to prepare machinery and equipment.
- Work may be postponed or rescheduled due to unforeseen circumstances.
