

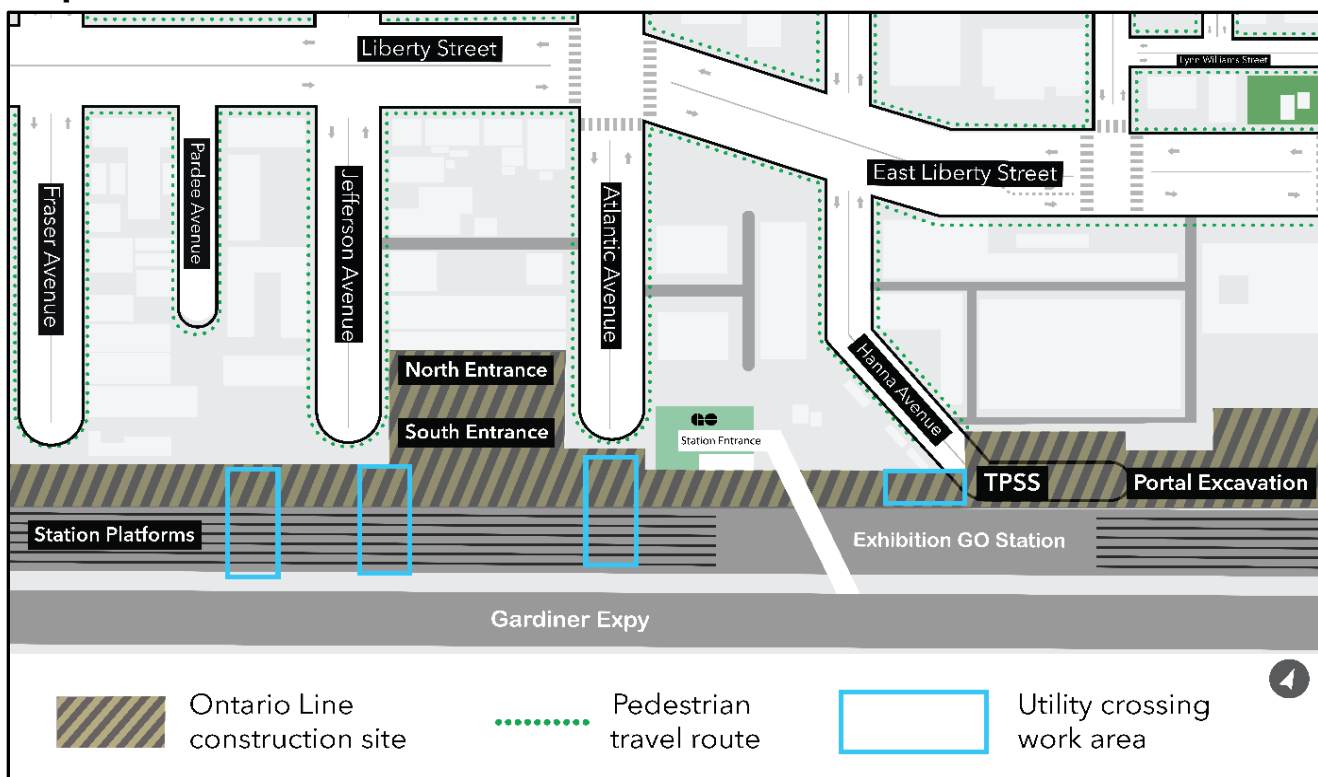
# Overnight Work: Exhibition utility crossing

**Expected Start Date:** As early as September 22, 2025

**Expected Duration:** Up to four months

**Hours of Work:** Monday through Saturday, from 7:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m.

## What is happening?

**To accommodate the future Ontario Line subway and the expanded Exhibition Station, crews will carry out advance electrical work by connecting utilities beneath the existing GO Lakeshore West rail corridor and within the site of the future Exhibition Station.**

The advance electrical work beneath the GO Lakeshore West rail corridor and within the site of the future Exhibition Station is necessary to prepare for the construction and future operation of the Ontario Line trains and the expanded Exhibition Station.

This phase of work will take place overnight in several locations throughout the site, between the future station platforms and the TPSS (traction power substation) as indicated on the map above.

# What to expect

- During this phase of construction crews will use trucks and trailers to deliver equipment or remove materials, as well as excavators, auger bore, skid steerer and other demolition equipment to connect a small tunnel from south to north, under the rail corridor.
- A hydrovac machine may be used when required.
- Work will take place six days a week, Monday through Saturday, from 7:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m.
- There is no expected impact on GO Transit operations or service.
- Residents and businesses can expect to hear noise from equipment working between the Gardiner Expressway, the rail corridor and the Ontario Line work zone.
- Work may be postponed or re-scheduled due to unforeseen circumstances.
- All necessary construction permits have been obtained.
