

Toronto Hydro Excavation on Stewart Street

Expected start date: As early as September 15, 2025

Expected completion date: Early October 2025

Hours of work: Weekdays, 7:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M.



What is happening?

- Toronto Hydro is permanently restoring Stewart Street to support the construction and future operations of King-Bathurst Station on the Ontario Line, ensuring smooth traffic and pedestrian flow and returning the road to pre-construction condition.
- Toronto Hydro through its contractor PaveKrete will be excavating and placing granular material, asphalt, and concrete along Stewart Street between Bathurst Street and Portland Street as a second phase of restoration works related to the supply of electricity to King-Bathurst Station. Earlier works to support this installation took place in 2024.

What to expect

- Work will begin as early as September 15, 2025.
 - Crews will set up in the curb lane and access manholes and hydro poles along the road.
 - Crews will alternate between occupancy of the north and south curb lanes, always maintaining access along the street as they proceed from west to east in stages.
 - Access to driveways will be maintained, temporary steel plates may be used to cover trenches as part of the process.
 - Short term temporary sidewalk closures and diversion are expected on the south side of Stewart east of Bathurst, along the west side of Portland between Stewart and Wellington, and at the corner of Portland and Stewart.
 - To maintain a traffic lane on Stewart Street during the works, temporary street parking restrictions will be in place.
 - The work is expected to take approximately two (2) weeks.
- Work will take place from Monday-Friday, 7:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M. There will be no overnight or weekend work related to this closure.
- Residents and businesses in the area may hear noise caused by work equipment. Crews will take measures to minimize noise impacts wherever possible.
- All necessary permits will be obtained by Toronto Hydro and their contractor.
- Work may be postponed or re-scheduled due to unforeseen circumstances.
