

# Preparation for elevated guideway and Thorncliffe Park Station construction

**Expected start date:** As early as October 17, 2025

**Expected duration:** Three months

**Hours of work:** Weekdays (Monday to Friday), 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.



## What is happening?

- An elevated guideway and new Ontario Line subway station will be built in Thorncliffe Park on the north side of Overlea Blvd.
- To build the new guideway and station, a construction site will be set up on the north side of Overlea Blvd. between Millwood Rd. and Thorncliffe Park Dr.
- Various activities will take place to prepare the site for construction.
- Activities will include:
  - Securing the site with fast-fence and wood hoarding
  - Installing monitoring equipment
  - Clearing, grubbing and tree removals
  - Removing abandoned utilities
  - Grading and compaction
  - Delivering equipment, supplies and site trailers
- These activities will begin as early as October 17 and will take place within the work zones shown on the maps below.
- Sidewalk closures will be required to accommodate this work. Please review the full notice for

specific details on traffic, pedestrian and transit impacts.

## Traffic and pedestrian details

### Phase one - mid-October to early November

- The sidewalk on the north side of Overlea Blvd. between Millwood Rd. and Leaside Park Dr. will be closed. Pedestrians will be redirected to the south sidewalk.
- The sidewalk in front of 2 Overlea Blvd. on the north side will remain open to maintain access to the TTC bus stop.

### Phase two - Mid-November to early December:

- The sidewalk closure on the north side of Overlea Blvd. will extend to 26 Overlea Blvd. at Thorncliffe Park Dr.
- The bus stop in front of 14 Overlea Blvd. will remain open and accessible via the signalized intersection at Leaside Park Dr.

### Phase three - December to late January:

- The sidewalk closure will extend east to 42 Overlea Blvd. (Costco).
- The bus stop in front of 28 Overlea Blvd. will remain open and accessible via the signalized intersection at Thorncliffe Park Dr.
- Driveway and pedestrian access will be maintained at 2 Overlea Blvd. throughout this work.
- Driveways will be maintained at 14, 16, 20 Overlea Blvd. throughout this work, and pedestrians can access these properties via the signalized intersection at Leaside Park Dr.
- In January 2026, a temporary sidewalk will be installed on the north side of Overlea Blvd. and pedestrian access will be reinstated. At this stage, both sidewalks on Overlea Blvd. will be open, and two lanes of traffic in each direction will be maintained.

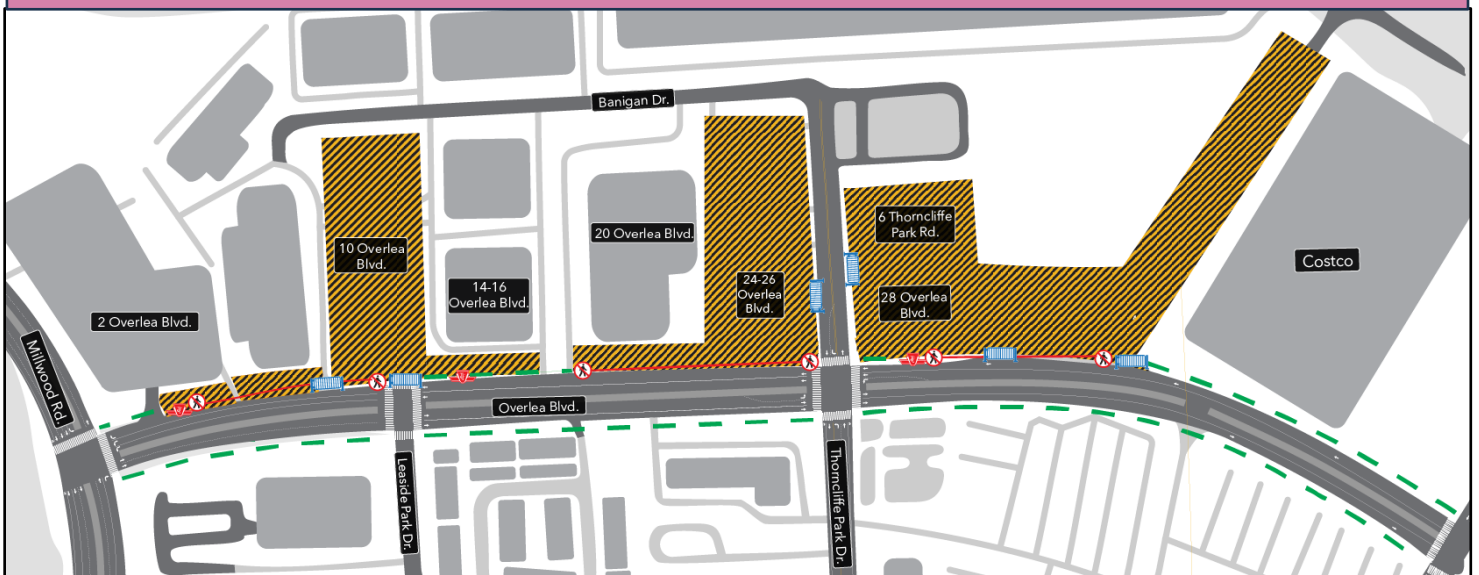

## What to expect

- Wayfinding signage will be posted to safely guide pedestrians, cyclists, and drivers.
- Excavators, trucks, loaders, skid steerers, rollers, and other heavy machinery will be used to complete this work.
- Vehicles will enter the work zones from the access gates along Overlea Blvd. and at Thorncliffe Park Dr.
- Monitors will be installed in the sidewalks, roadways, and on adjacent buildings.
- Noise and vibration from construction equipment can be expected.
- Crews will take measures to minimize construction impacts wherever possible.
- All equipment will be safely secured within the fenced work area.
- The work site will be enclosed with plywood hoarding and fencing to ensure safety and restrict public access.

### Note:

- Work may be delayed, rescheduled or extended due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.
